

2012 Regional Council Process & Consolidated Funding Applications

Background:

The Regional Economic Development Councils are a community driven, regional approach to economic development in New York State. Each Council is made up of 20 to 30 business, academic and government leaders from throughout the Region. In 2012, the Senate and Assembly majority committees selected one member from each region to be a voting Regional Council member.

In 2011, each of the ten Regional Councils were tasked with developing a five-year strategic plan that included a comprehensive vision for economic development for that region, regional strategies to achieve that vision, and specific priority projects that are significant, regionally supported and capable of stimulating economic investment.¹ Empire State Development Corporation developed a competitive process in which Regional Council Strategic Plans containing recommendations for funding made by each Regional Council were reviewed by a Strategic Plan Review Committee consisting of two State Agency Commissioners and three economic development experts. Members of the 2011 Review Team included: Dall W. Forsythe, Senior Fellow at the Wagner School of Public Service at New York University and former Vice President for Finance and Operations at The Atlantic Philanthropies; Walter D. Broadnax, Professor of Public Administration at The Maxwell School of Syracuse University; Bruce J. Katz, Vice President at the Brookings Institution and founding Director of the Brookings Metropolitan Policy Program; Joan McDonald, Commissioner of the New York State Department of Transportation; and Cesar Perales, New York State Secretary of State. On December 8, 2011, the Governor and Legislative Leaders announced the winners of the first round of competition and one year later 97% of Round One projects were under contract and/or progressing.

In 2012, the Councils went a step further and produced Strategic Implementation Agendas that built upon the progress from the first round and further developed and refined their Regional Five Year Strategic Plans by undertaking four primary activities: Establishing a framework to advance the Regional Strategic Plan; Implementing the strategies laid out in the Strategic Plan; Creating a project pipeline; and providing a progress report documenting the success the Council has had in implementing its Strategic Plan. These actions were designed to encourage and accelerate implementation, performance, and collaboration within the regions. Priority projects that aligned with each region's agenda were chosen by the Councils from the applications submitted to the Consolidated Funding Application portal. These projects were published in the regions' Implementation Agendas, which are publically available online at www.regionalcouncils.ny.gov. Projects were scored by both the state agencies and the Regional Councils. The agencies scored their projects based on a technical evaluation in adherence with existing funding program guidelines and awarded a project up to 80 points. The remaining 20 points were awarded by the Regional Councils, and were based off the following endorsement standards:

Statewide Endorsement Standards

Regional Council members will determine the degree to which the application implements the regional strategic plan and assign the corresponding number of points as a score.

2012 Competition:

To incentivize the implementation process, the Regional Councils competed for \$220 million in ESD capital funds and tax credits based on their Implementation Agendas. In 2012, five awards of \$25 million were made. The competition was split into two parts:

- First, the four regions with the 2011 Best Plans competed for two awards of up to \$25 million each in capital funds. Awards were made based on the progress the Regional Councils have made implementing their strategies and evolution of their strategic plans as outlined in their submitted Implementation Agendas including any revisions or updates.
- Second, the remaining six regions competed for three awards of up to \$25 million each in capital funds. Awards were made based on the progress the Regional Councils have made implementing their strategies and evolution of their strategic plans as outlined in their submitted Implementation Agendas including any revisions or updates.

The balance of the \$25 million in capital funds was divided among the five remaining regions. Each region will also be eligible for up to \$10 million in Excelsior Tax Credits to help attract and grow business in the region.²

According to the enabling legislation as passed by the New York State legislature and signed into law by the Governor, “funding will be pursuant to a plan developed by the chief executive officer of the New York state Urban Development Corporation and based in part on a competitive selection process among the Regional Economic Development Councils and will support initiatives based on anticipated economic development benefits. Such moneys will be awarded by the New York State Urban Development Corporation at its discretion.”³

To reflect the changing nature of the competition, the 2012 Strategic Implementation Assessment Team was led by Secretary of State Cesar Peralas and included Office of General Services Commissioner Roann Destito, Tax and Finance Commissioner Thomas Mattox, Environmental Facilities Corporation CEO Matthew Driscoll and Agriculture and Markets Commissioner Darrel Aubertine with support from the Brookings Institution, vis a vis Bruce Katz and Amy Liu. The SIAT reviewed each region’s Implementation Agendas based on established criteria and also traveled to each Region to view and tour the progress first hand. Each tour included a panel presentation that allowed for ample question and answer opportunities between the SIAT and Regional Council members. Each of the ten Regional Council visits included a tour of projects funded in the 2011 CFA which demonstrated Regional Council progress and accomplishments.

The SIAT provided an assessment of each plan⁴ and made recommendations to Kenneth Adams, President & CEO, Empire State Development Corporation of the five reports that most closely aligned with these criteria.⁵ President Adams accepted the recommendations of the Committee and, pursuant to his statutory powers as head of the Urban Development Corporation, awarded five regions with the top Implementation Agenda up to \$40 million in funding consisting of \$25 million in capital grants and \$15 million in Excelsior tax credits for priority projects identified in their Strategic Plans. The balance of the incentives was awarded to projects identified by the Councils as in alignment with their strategies and priorities.

In addition, project sponsors applied for up to \$600 million in economic development resources available from ten state agencies through the Consolidated Funding Application (CFA). The CFA allows businesses and other entities to apply for multiple agency funding sources through a single, web-based application. Awards for CFA projects were made based on the endorsement of the local Regional Council⁶ and the technical program review of the agencies providing resources, subject to interagency team analysis and agency discretion.⁷

In 2012, the CFA opened for applications on May 3 and closed on July 14. Prior to that, all details about CFA resources were made available online via the 2012 CFA Resources Available Document, the State Register and the New York State Contract Reporter. When the portal closed on July 14, agencies immediately began marking projects eligible or ineligible. All eligible projects were then made available to the Regional Councils for their scoring process and the agencies for their technical evaluation. Scores had to be finalized by September 15. After the SIAT Tours concluded, the Inter-agency team met to review the projects and make final funding decisions.

The interagency team reviewed projects based on relevant factors including Regional Councils Implementation Agendas and designation of priority projects, project alignment with regional goals and objectives, funding availability and regional need.⁸ Priority projects are those specifically enumerated in the Regional Council Reports, receiving a score of 20 from the Regional Council, and identified as significant, regionally supported and capable of stimulating economic investment.

The interagency team once again consisted of professional staff from relevant agencies and authorities' with detailed knowledge of their respective CFA program funding. This group conducted an analytical assessment that provided the basis for project funding recommendations made by individual agencies for final approval by respective agency or authority head. As provided in the budget, the Regional Council capital fund was awarded by ESD in its discretion.

This process resulted in funding of projects that aligned with a long term, regionally generated implementation agendas and are capable of stimulating economic growth and investment.

On December 19, 2012, the Governor announced that 725 projects totaling \$738 million had been awarded through Round Two of the Regional Economic Development Council initiative. Best Plan awards were given to Central New York, Mid Hudson, Southern Tier, North Country and Finger Lakes in adherence to the competition guidelines detailed above.

Assessment of the 2012 Progress Report

Part One: Strategic Plan Update

Building on the 2011 Strategic Plan

A. Addressing weaknesses identified in the 2011 assessment

The Mid-Hudson Regional Economic Development Council (MHREDC) updated its strategic plan to address 6 out of 10 opportunities for improvement noted in 2011. Each goal supporting its core strategies has been expanded to include a description of future actions and a timeframe for completion.

The MHREDC solicited an expanded array of projects (68, up from 12) and identified 22 (up from 3) as priority projects, each with demonstrated links to its revised strategic plan. Each priority project description now specifies a requested funding allocation as well as sources of other funding and number of jobs to be created. In total, the MHREDC has identified \$671.8 million in other funds to support the \$106.5 million capital request for its 22 priority projects. Many of the priority projects are described as having spin off effects on employment or serving as incubators for new jobs. Numerous MHREDC member-led initiatives advanced core strategies, such as creation of the Hudson Valley Food and Beverage Alliance and the Center for Global Advanced Manufacturing.

Not addressed was the MHREDC nine point performance measurement system which the prior assessment noted for its complexity and potential for difficult implementation.

B. Building upon strengths in the 2011 assessment

The 2011 strategic plan assessment affirmed the potential of the Mid-Hudson Regional Economic Development Council's (MHREDC) goals and strategies and, in the main, MHREDC has retained and improved them. The MHREDC streamlined and reorganized its goals and strategies resulting in improved clarity and logic in the plan. The MHREDC continued its public outreach and success was evident culminating in 251 CFAs received in 2012 – the second highest number per region.

Strategies

MHREDC streamlined and reorganized its 15 goals down to four core strategies and four supporting strategies. Many of the goals and strategies previously identified continue to fit under the refined strategies, and the discussion supporting the reorganization demonstrates a logical interrelationship among them. For example, while tourism and agriculture aren't usually grouped together as economic sectors, the mutual link to shared natural resources in the Mid-Hudson Valley justifies considering them together for planning purposes.

The MHREDC developed supporting strategies which are intended to promote all core strategies and include a focus on workforce development, entrepreneurship, public-private collaboration and a correlated legislative agenda. Workforce initiatives appear more focused on high skill than middle and

lower skill level development. However, a strategy designed to promote entrepreneurship, small business, and MWBEs more generally support MWBE start-ups and expansions.

Within the technology sector, MHREDC focuses on biotech, manufacturing and IT. Its focus on mature anchor employers includes the food and beverage, distribution and healthcare sectors. Its third core strategy, growing natural resource dependent sectors, focuses on tourism, waterfront development, agriculture and recreation. Finally, its infrastructure strategy focuses on housing and urban revitalization. Naturally, the Tappan Zee Bridge project will have a substantial impact on the Mid-Hudson Valley.

Implementation Agenda

The MHREDC sets forth specific actions and timeframes for implementing its revised core and supporting strategies over the next 15 months. The level of specificity of action items varies substantially as does the degree to which a specific action will advance a particular strategy. Most projects already underway have comparatively more specific action items; however none of the action items for the fourth core strategy - infrastructure revitalization - include specific detail.

The implementation matrix has been reformatted and expanded to address the core strategies. To advance their technology core strategy, MHREDC members have identified improving access to capital as an important deliverable. As an action item, members have agreed to convene leading life science venture capitalists, demonstrating that the MHREDC agenda for implementation is not limited to projects already receiving state funding or projects solely dependent on state funding. It also demonstrates recognition of the critical role that private funding plays in advancing that core strategy. Another example includes steps underway to investigate whether excess space and capacity at Pfizer's facilities can be repurposed to advance the tech core strategy.

To advance their second core strategy, attracting and retaining mature industries, several MHREDC members founded the Hudson Valley Food and Beverage Alliance with a goal of local sourcing goods and services within the sector. Future action items clearly chart a path of expansion, marketing and education. However, there does not appear to be an implementation agenda to attract and retain financial and professional service companies, another component of the second core strategy.

Action items (other than priority projects) on the implementation agenda to promote the MHREDC's third core strategy, growing natural resource related sectors, consist of interim organizing steps such as inventorying open space, monitoring hotel construction and supporting federal land preservation and water quality legislation. Action items for the fourth core strategy - infrastructure revitalization - lack specificity other than for identified priority projects.

Readiness for construction did not appear to be a priority project selection criterion.

Part Two: Progress Made Implementing Strategies

Progress

A. Organizational progress

The MHREDC created a Strategies Committee which streamlined and reorganized its 15 goals down to four core strategies and four supporting strategies. A Marketing Committee was also created to draft a marketing plan to shape and implement public outreach, and to clearly communicate the streamlined strategies.

The progress report includes a discussion of various member-led initiatives to advance core strategies. MHREDC members from a particular sector generally organized initiatives within the core strategy under which their sector fell. Initiatives in biotech, IT, food and beverage, land conservation and housing are prominent examples.

In July 2012, the MHREDC sent a call for priority project proposals which described the Council's focus, priority project scoring criteria, and the priority project application. Its substantial outreach resulted in the submission of 251 CFAs – the second highest number for a region. Additional solicitations for priority projects consistent with core strategies yielded a pipeline of 68 potential priority projects of which 22 were selected for MHREDC endorsement.

B. Examples of progress

The region's progress in implementing the goals and strategies in its strategic plan is mixed. Some areas show significant progress and promise, and reflect great involvement of the MHREDC. In other areas progress has occurred consistent with plan strategies but the direct involvement of the MHREDC is unclear.

Several MHREDC members founded the Hudson Valley Food and Beverage Alliance with a goal of local sourcing goods and services within the sector. Over 220 local leaders attended the initial kick-off event and future action items clearly chart a path of expansion, marketing and education.

Impressive progress was shown in the New York Medical College and Center for Global Advanced Manufacturing projects and the Hudson Valley Food and Beverage Alliance. Each is clearly a unique undertaking, and each reflects substantial MHREDC member effort and initiative but what is especially noteworthy is not just the progress made, but the possibility that the progress is related to what they have in common with each other. Each project has a substantial component of shared services, shared facilities, early stage business support or other mutually beneficial private sector activity that expands business opportunities and reduces costs of entry and operating inefficiencies for both current and future participants.

The iBio project on the NY Medical College campus, an example of an incubator project which will establish a platform for entrepreneurs and startup companies, was launched with a \$10 million equity commitment from the College. Construction has commenced and the facility is slated to open in 2013.

Substantially all priority projects include non-state funded components. The MHREDC has also demonstrated progress implementing strategies through non-state funded actions. The progress report included specific descriptions of numerous MHREDC member-led initiatives to advance core strategies. Organizing a bio tech venture capital conferences, creating the Hudson Valley Food and Beverage Alliance and the Center for Global Advanced Manufacturing are examples.

Leveraging of Resources

The MHREDC has identified \$671.8 million in other funds to support the \$106.5 million capital request for its 22 priority projects proposed for 2012. Federal and local government contributions, private and NGO co-funding and support and philanthropy are present in almost every priority project proposed by the Council.

The NY BioHud Valley, a consortium of over 60 pharmaceutical and bio tech companies is partnering with county, state and federal entities, including the council, to promote new sector entrants in the Region. The Hudson Valley Food and Beverage Alliance, co-founded by Council members, coordinates networking opportunities and training seminars to advance local sourcing of products and services within the sector. The New York Medical College project presents future leveraging opportunities by reducing costs for new or expanding business through shared services and facilities.

Performance Measures

The MHREDC has nine indicators to identify economic development trends in the region – number of employees, wages and business creation for example. It intends to apply them in the future to adjust strategies and identify future priority projects. It is unclear how the indicators are related to the various sectors reflected in the core strategies, and how the data would inform specific strategy adjustments.

Process

The report lists 19 meetings or forums for the REDC plan and notes usage of Facebook and Twitter to disseminate information and receive feedback. The most significant evidence of the MHREDC engaging stakeholders in the implementation of its revised strategies is the success it experienced soliciting priority projects.

The MHREDC proposes to start a dialogue with investors who engage in both early- and later-stage venture investments, partly to raise the profile of Hudson Valley bio-medical companies, in the fall of 2012.
