#### 2012 Regional Council Process & Consolidated Funding Applications

#### Background:

The Regional Economic Development Councils are a community driven, regional approach to economic development in New York State. Each Council is made up of 20 to 30 business, academic and government leaders from throughout the Region. In 2012, the Senate and Assembly majority committees selected one member from each region to be a voting Regional Council member.

In 2011, each of the ten Regional Councils were tasked with developing a five-year strategic plan that included a comprehensive vision for ecoomic development for that region, regional strategies to achieve that vision, and specific priority projects that are significant, regionally supported and capable of stimulating economic investment.<sup>1</sup> Empire State Development Corporation developed a competitive process in which Regional Council Strategic Plans containing recommendations for funding made by each Regional Council were reviewed by a Strategic Plan Review Committee consisting of two State Agency Commissioners and three economic development experts. Members of the 2011 Review Team included: Dall W. Forsythe, Senior Fellow at the Wagner School of Public Service at New York University and former Vice President for Finance and Operations at The Atlantic Philanthropies; Walter D. Broadnax, Professor of Public Administration at The Maxwell School of Syracuse University; Bruce J. Katz, Vice President at the Brookings Institution and founding Director of the Brookings Metropolitan Policy Program; Joan McDonald, Commissioner of the New York State Department of Transportation; and Cesar Perales, New York State Secretary of State. On December 8, 2011, the Governor and Legislative Leaders announced the winners of the first round of competition and one year later 97% of Round One projects were under contract and/or progressing.

In 2012, the Councils went a step further and produced Strategic Implementation Agendas that built upon the progress from the first round and further developed and refined their Regional Five Year Strategic Plans by undertaking four primary activities: Establishing a framework to advance the Regional Strategic Plan; Implementing the strategies laid out in the Strategic Plan; Creating a project pipeline; and providing a progress report documenting the success the Council has had in implementing its Strategic Plan. These actions were designed to encourage and accelerate implementation, performance, and collaboration within the regions. Priority projects that aligned with each region's agenda were chosen by the Councils from the applications submitted to the Consolidated Funding Application portal. These projects were published in the regions' Implementation Agendas, which are publically available online at www.regionalcouncils.ny.gov. Projects were scored by both the state agencies and the Regional Councils. The agencies scored their projects based on a technical evaluation in adherence with existing funding program guidelines and awarded a project up to 80 points. The remaining 20 points were awarded by the Regional Councils, and were based off the following endorsement standards:

#### **2012 Competition:**

To incentivize the implementation process, the Regional Councils competed for \$220 million in ESD capital funds and tax credits based on their Implementation Agendas. In 2012, five awards of \$25 million were made. The competition was split into two parts:

• First, the four regions with the 2011 Best Plans competed for two awards of up to \$25 million each in capital funds. Awards were made based on the progress the Regional Councils have made implementing their strategies and evolution of their strategic plans as outlined in their submitted Implementation Agendas including any revisions or updates.

• Second, the remaining six regions competed for three awards of up to \$25 million each in capital funds. Awards were made based on the progress the Regional Councils have made implementing their strategies and evolution of their strategic plans as outlined in their submitted Implementation Agendas including any revisions or updates.

The balance of the \$25 million in capital funds was divided among the five remaining regions. Each region will also be eligible for up to \$10 million in Excelsior Tax Credits to help attract and grow business in the region.<sup>2</sup>

According to the enabling legislation as passed by the New York State legislature and signed into law by the Governor, "funding will be pursuant to a plan developed by the chief executive officer of the New York state Urban Development Corporation and based in part on a competitive selection process among the Regional Economic Development Councils and will support initiatives based on anticipated economic development benefits. Such moneys will be awarded by the New York State Urban Development Corporation at its discretion."<sup>3</sup>

To reflect the changing nature of the competition, the 2012 Strategic Implementation Assessment Team was led by Secretary of State Cesar Perales and included Office of General Services Commissioner Roann Destito, Tax and Finance Commissioner Thomas Mattox, Environmental Facilities Corporation CEO Matthew Driscoll and Agriculture and Markets Commissioner Darrel Aubuertine with support from the Brookings Institution, vis a vis Bruce Katz and Amy Liu. The SIAT reviewed each region's Implementation Agendas based on established criteria and also traveled to each Region to view and tour the progress first hand. Each tour included a panel presentation that allowed for ample question and answer opportunities between the SIAT and Regional Council members. Each of the ten Regional Council visits included a tour of projects funded in the 2011 CFA which demonstrated Regional Council progress and accomplishments.

The SIAT provided an assessment of each plan<sup>4</sup> and made recommendations to Kenneth Adams, President & CEO, Empire State Development Corporation of the five reports that most closely aligned with these criteria.<sup>5</sup> President Adams accepted the recommendations of the Committee and, pursuant to his statutory powers as head of the Urban Development Corporation, awarded five regions with the top Implementation Agenda up to \$40 million in funding consisting of \$25 million in capital grants and \$15 million in Excelsior tax credits for priority projects identified in their Strategic Plans. The balance of the incentives was awarded to projects identified by the Councils as in alignment with their strategies and priorities.

In addition, project sponsors applied for up to \$600 million in economic development resources available from ten state agencies through the Consolidated Funding Application (CFA). The CFA allows businesses and other entities to apply for multiple agency funding sources through a single, web-based application. Awards for CFA projects were made based on the endorsement of the local Regional Council<sup>6</sup> and the technical program review of the agencies providing resources, subject to interagency team analysis and agency discretion.<sup>7</sup>

In 2012, the CFA opened for applications on May 3 and closed on July 14. Prior to that, all details about CFA resources were made available online via the 2012 CFA Resources Available Document, the State Register and the New York State Contract Reporter. When the portal closed on July 14, agencies immediately began marking projects eligible or ineligible. All eligible projects were then made available to the Regional Councils for their scoring process and the agencies for their technical evaluation. Scores had to be finalized by September 15. After the SIAT Tours concluded, the Inter-agency team met to review the projects and make final funding decisions.

The interagency team reviewed projects based on relevant factors including Regional Councils Implementation Agendas and designation of priority projects, project alignment with regional goals and objectives, funding availability and regional need.<sup>8</sup> Priority projects are those specifically enumerated in the Regional Council Reports, receiving a score of 20 from the Regional Council, and identified as significant, regionally supported and capable of stimulating economic investment.

The interagency team once again consisted of professional staff from relevant agencies and authorities' with detailed knowledge of their respective CFA program funding. This group conducted an analytical assessment that provided the basis for project funding recommendations made by individual agencies for final approval by respective agency or authority head. As provided in the budget, the Regional Council capital fund was awarded by ESD in its discretion.

This process resulted in funding of projects that aligned with a long term, regionally generated implementation agendas and are capable of stimulating economic growth and investment.

On December 19, 2012, the Governor announced that 725 projects totaling \$738 million had been awarded through Round Two of the Regional Economic Development Council initiative. Best Plan awards were given to Central New York, Mid Hudson, Southern Tier, North Country and Finger Lakes in adherence to the competition guidelines detailed above.

# Part One: Strategic Plan Update

# Building on the 2011 Strategic Plan

# A. Addressing weaknesses identified in the 2011 assessments

The New York City Regional Economic Development Council (NYCREDC) addressed 2 of the 6 weaknesses identified in the 2011 strategic plan. It provided clearer linkages between projects and the need for human capital/workforce development, particularly for unskilled and low-income workers. It also addressed the lack of an implementation plan for the data collection, analysis and monitoring of performance measures by creating a process for monitoring the progress of priority projects.

A continuing problem is the lack of attention to NYC's affordable housing challenges. Affordable housing is a measureable outcome in the progress report for some priority projects and 19 affordable housing projects received 2011 CFA awards, supporting a total of 707 new or renovated units. However, the updated plan continues to lack details on the specific sources and uses of leveraged funds and public funds already committed to priority projects. However, leveraged resources for some priority projects are presented in aggregate.

A majority of the proposed 2012 priority projects are large construction projects that first require the development of plans, compliance with Federal, State and local regulatory requirements and the issuance of certifications and permits before construction can begin.

# B. Building upon strengths identified in the 2011 assessment

The NYCREDC continues to build on the strengths identified in the 2011 assessment. It prioritized projects that have a catalytic effect; encouraged citywide public participation and input; and clearly identified the NYCREDC's role and the support it will provide to implement the strategies outlined in the plan.

The NYCREDC continues to implement strategies that address the needs in each of the five boroughs, and show strengths such as inter-regional collaboration and economic benefit, collaborative effort between academia and the public and private sector, creation of opportunities and support for small businesses and MWBEs and desire to enter into new markets. The priority projects continue to include significant leveraging from public, private and academia financial partnerships.

Finally, the NYCREDC continues to demonstrate performance measurements for each proposed project and is tracking and evaluating each project on the basis of meeting certain quantitative measures, including: direct and indirect job creation and retention targets; leverage of non state-funding; timeliness of performance; contribution to increased economic activity; and generation of tax revenues.

### **Strategies**

Key strategy modifications made by the NYCREDC include identification of workforce development and training as a critical factor in economic growth and inclusiveness, and inclusion of measurable accomplishments to be achieved in the 15 opportunity zones. The NYCREDC adopted three additional criteria for identifying priority projects for funding or other state assistance as part of the second competitive round of project funding: interregional cooperation to building industry clusters across multiple regions of New York State; partnerships between business and institutions of higher education; and private sector investment and engagement.

There are 15 Opportunity Zones across the five boroughs which are formerly distressed or underutilized areas that have undergone major rezoning, planning and public investment during the past decade and are now poised for accelerated and sustainable growth. The Opportunity Zone strategy stems from recognition that NYC's size and diversity requires resources to be concentrated in priority locations in order to: generate meaningful results; accelerate redevelopment; generate private investment; and allow the state to expand its economic stimulus focus into new areas of need.

The NYCREDC is focusing on key industries where there is a mismatch between business demand and skilled workers (particularly low-skilled and low-income workers) through: NYC's Department of Small Business Services and the NYC Office of Human Capital Development.

# **Implementation Agenda**

The NYCREDC implementation agenda for advancing strategies is largely project based. The narrative on progress for the priority projects includes immediate priorities and project next steps, and most included general timelines by which actions will be done. In 2011 six priority projects were described as "ready to go."

The Council's focus on 15 opportunity zones and justification for selecting priority projects is designed to be supportive of more than one regional strategy rather than a single strategy, but at this phase of implementation it is difficult to ascertain how progress at the priority project level is transforming the Opportunity Zone. It is also difficult to determine the NYCREDC's influence or impact on overall economic activity within the Opportunity Zones. For example, it is not clear for most projects if the NYCREDC has the lead on a particular action or whether it is a partner entity.

The NYCREDC adopted three new criteria for selecting priority projects: interregional cooperation; partnerships between business and institutions of higher education; and private sector investment and engagement.

# Part Two: Progress Made Implementing Strategies

### Progress

#### A. Organizational progress

The NYCREDC has created an Infrastructure and Capital Improvements Committee to review, prioritize and monitor progress on relevant proposed or pending infrastructure and development activity in targeted Opportunity Zones. The NYCREDC created a process for monitoring the progress of priority projects through regular status reports, and publishing these reports on the NYCREDC website for public dissemination. The

mayor's office and NYCEDC have taken responsibility for tracking and reporting to the REDC the status of priority projects and Opportunity Zone activities. The NYCREDC also established a committee to review any timing, financing or feasibility discrepancies, which would then be reported to the executive committee for appropriate action.

The progress report describes a public participation process for gathering input into the CFA review process and for establishing a priority project pipeline. This involved public forums and public outreach by individual council members and state agencies to inform elected officials, project sponsors and community representatives about the role and responsibilities of the council and about CFA funding opportunities. Projects were selected based on previously published criteria.

# **B.** Examples of progress

The NYCREDC has taken significant steps to focus on removing barriers to brokering agreements between the City and private investors across the priority projects. For example, the NYCREDC aligned implementation of its strategic plan with the NYC Department of Small Business Services and the NYC Office of Human Capital to leverage the City's Workforce1 Career Centers and Local Workforce Investment Board to help bridge the gap between business demand and the supply of skilled workers.

The Hunts Point Terminal Produce Market is creating a food industry cluster supported by a supply chain of agricultural processing and retail activity across the State. Notable is the increased commitment of ESD to the project; with a revised award of \$50 million. The Hunts Point Produce Market was also awarded a \$10 million TIGER grant from the U.S. Department of Transportation to modernize its rail and intermodal transfer facilities.

Selection of the Brooklyn Navy Yard Green Manufacturing Center was a catalytic event that resulted in immediate job creation and an explosion of interest and investment in Brooklyn. The project is elevating the capacity of the Navy Yard as a model for an industrial park featuring advanced manufacturing and high-tech jobs. In addition, the Navy Yard, Downtown Brooklyn, the Brooklyn Academy of Music and Metrotech are attracting emerging technology talent and entrepreneurship.

Applied Sciences NYC Initiative is a citywide initiative designed to create engineering talent and advance NYC as a national and global center of science and technology innovation. The Cornell University and the Technion-Israel Institute of Technology announced they will build a \$2 billion, two-million-square-foot applied science and engineering campus on Roosevelt Island. In partnership with Google, Technion-Cornell will open an interim program in the city this fall, where Google will provide 22,000 square feet at its New York City headquarters to Cornell. New York City and the MTA announced an agreement with a New York University-led consortium to build the Center for Urban Science and Progress campus in the former MTA building at 370 Jay Street, and to support expansion of Columbia University's engineering school.

It is not evident from the progress report how the NYCREDC has made progress implementing strategies through non-state funded actions, nor it is clear how NYCREDC was directly involved in most CFA funded projects.

# Leveraging of Resources

Fifty projects were funded by the 2011 CFA with a total award amount of \$66,164,721, and an expected total project value of \$741,886,283. Partner contributions to the total project cost are provided for four of the five capital funding priority projects, although the public and private funding sources could be better documented. NYCREDC's 2011 priority projects are all part of larger initiatives to create leverageable assets.

The NYCREDC has become more cohesive and more visible in the city and state, bringing additional transparency and "ground up" engagement to local economic development planning and implementation. As a result, the region has developed new or expanded partnerships with private, not-for-profit and other government entities relating to technical assistance, staff expertise and institutional resources.

### **Performance Measures**

The NYCREDC identified specific performance measures to assess progress of projects and actions in the 2011 Strategic Plan. Descriptions of performance measures is project-specific, including data in descriptions of 2011 CFAs progress, and proposed targets in 2012 priority project descriptions, such as direct and indirect job creation and retention targets, and leveraging of non-state funding, as applicable. However, there is no aggregate description of progress based on the performance measures.

#### Process

The NYCREDC has strengthened the public participation process for purposes of gathering more input into the CFA review process and establishing a 2012-13 priority project pipeline. This has involved public forums as well as public outreach by individual council members and state agencies to inform elected officials, project sponsors and community representatives about the role and responsibilities of the council and about CFA funding opportunities.

A draft version of the progress report was made available to the general public through the NYCREDC website, followed by a public forum where comments and suggestions were gathered and later incorporated into the final document.

Additionally, the council took steps to market its proposals to parties outside of the region, including Hudson Valley food growers and Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, and made progress in securing agreements for both the Hunts Point Food Co-Op and SeedStart.
