## 2012 Regional Council Process & Consolidated Funding Applications

## Background:

The Regional Economic Development Councils are a community driven, regional approach to economic development in New York State. Each Council is made up of 20 to 30 business, academic and government leaders from throughout the Region. In 2012, the Senate and Assembly majority committees selected one member from each region to be a voting Regional Council member.

In 2011, each of the ten Regional Councils were tasked with developing a five-year strategic plan that included a comprehensive vision for ecoomic development for that region, regional strategies to achieve that vision, and specific priority projects that are significant, regionally supported and capable of stimulating economic investment. Empire State Development Corporation developed a competitive process in which Regional Council Strategic Plans containing recommendations for funding made by each Regional Council were reviewed by a Strategic Plan Review Committee consisting of two State Agency Commissioners and three economic development experts. Members of the 2011 Review Team included: Dall W. Forsythe, Senior Fellow at the Wagner School of Public Service at New York University and former Vice President for Finance and Operations at The Atlantic Philanthropies; Walter D. Broadnax, Professor of Public Administration at The Maxwell School of Syracuse University; Bruce J. Katz, Vice President at the Brookings Institution and founding Director of the Brookings Metropolitan Policy Program; Joan McDonald, Commissioner of the New York State Department of Transportation; and Cesar Perales, New York State Secretary of State. On December 8, 2011, the Governor and Legislative Leaders announced the winners of the first round of competition and one year later 97% of Round One projects were under contract and/or progressing.

In 2012, the Councils went a step further and produced Strategic Implementation Agendas that built upon the progress from the first round and further developed and refined their Regional Five Year Strategic Plans by undertaking four primary activities: Establishing a framework to advance the Regional Strategic Plan; Implementing the strategies laid out in the Strategic Plan; Creating a project pipeline; and providing a progress report documenting the success the Council has had in implementing its Strategic Plan. These actions were designed to encourage and accelerate implementation, performance, and collaboration within the regions. Priority projects that aligned with each region's agenda were chosen by the Councils from the applications submitted to the Consolidated Funding Application portal. These projects were published in the regions' Implementation Agendas, which are publically available online at <a href="https://www.regionalcouncils.ny.gov">www.regionalcouncils.ny.gov</a>. Projects were scored by both the state agencies and the Regional Councils. The agencies scored their projects based on a technical evaluation in adherence with existing funding program guidelines and awarded a project up to 80 points. The remaining 20 points were awarded by the Regional Councils, and were based off the following endorsement standards:

Regional Council members will determine the degree to which the application implements the regional strategic plan and assign the corresponding number of points as a score.

## 2012 Competition:

To incentivize the implementation process, the Regional Councils competed for \$220 million in ESD capital funds and tax credits based on their Implementation Agendas. In 2012, five awards of \$25 million were made. The competition was split into two parts:

- First, the four regions with the 2011 Best Plans competed for two awards of up to \$25 million each in capital funds. Awards were made based on the progress the Regional Councils have made implementing their strategies and evolution of their strategic plans as outlined in their submitted Implementation Agendas including any revisions or updates.
- Second, the remaining six regions competed for three awards of up to \$25 million each in capital funds. Awards were made based on the progress the Regional Councils have made implementing their strategies and evolution of their strategic plans as outlined in their submitted Implementation Agendas including any revisions or updates.

The balance of the \$25 million in capital funds was divided among the five remaining regions. Each region will also be eligible for up to \$10 million in Excelsior Tax Credits to help attract and grow business in the region.<sup>2</sup>

According to the enabling legislation as passed by the New York State legislature and signed into law by the Governor, "funding will be pursuant to a plan developed by the chief executive officer of the New York state Urban Development Corporation and based in part on a competitive selection process among the Regional Economic Development Councils and will support initiatives based on anticipated economic development benefits. Such moneys will be awarded by the New York State Urban Development Corporation at its discretion." <sup>3</sup>

To reflect the changing nature of the competition, the 2012 Strategic Implementation Assessment Team was led by Secretary of State Cesar Perales and included Office of General Services Commissioner Roann Destito, Tax and Finance Commissioner Thomas Mattox, Environmental Facilities Corporation CEO Matthew Driscoll and Agriculture and Markets Commissioner Darrel Aubuertine with support from the Brookings Institution, vis a vis Bruce Katz and Amy Liu. The SIAT reviewed each region's Implementation Agendas based on established criteria and also traveled to each Region to view and tour the progress first hand. Each tour included a panel presentation that allowed for ample question and answer opportunities between the SIAT and Regional Council members. Each of the ten Regional Council visits included a tour of projects funded in the 2011 CFA which demonstrated Regional Council progress and accomplishments.

The SIAT provided an assessment of each plan<sup>4</sup> and made recommendations to Kenneth Adams, President & CEO, Empire State Development Corporation of the five reports that most closely aligned with these criteria.<sup>5</sup> President Adams accepted the recommendations of the Committee and, pursuant to his statutory powers as head of the Urban Development Corporation, awarded five regions with the top Implementation Agenda up to \$40 million in funding consisting of \$25 million in capital grants and \$15 million in Excelsior tax credits for priority projects identified in their Strategic Plans. The balance of the incentives was awarded to projects identified by the Councils as in alignment with their strategies and priorities.

In addition, project sponsors applied for up to \$600 million in economic development resources available from ten state agencies through the Consolidated Funding Application (CFA). The CFA allows businesses and other entities to apply for multiple agency funding sources through a single, web-based application. Awards for CFA projects were made based on the endorsement of the local Regional Council<sup>6</sup> and the technical program review of the agencies providing resources, subject to interagency team analysis and agency discretion.<sup>7</sup>

In 2012, the CFA opened for applications on May 3 and closed on July 14. Prior to that, all details about CFA resources were made available online via the 2012 CFA Resources Available Document, the State Register and the New York State Contract Reporter. When the portal closed on July 14, agencies immediately began marking projects eligible or ineligible. All eligible projects were then made available to the Regional Councils for their scoring process and the agencies for their technical evaluation. Scores had to be finalized by September 15. After the SIAT Tours concluded, the Inter-agency team met to review the projects and make final funding decisions.

The interagency team reviewed projects based on relevant factors including Regional Councils Implementation Agendas and designation of priority projects, project alignment with regional goals and objectives, funding availability and regional need.<sup>8</sup> Priority projects are those specifically enumerated in the Regional Council Reports, receiving a score of 20 from the Regional Council, and identified as significant, regionally supported and capable of stimulating economic investment.

The interagency team once again consisted of professional staff from relevant agencies and authorities' with detailed knowledge of their respective CFA program funding. This group conducted an analytical assessment that provided the basis for project funding recommendations made by individual agencies for final approval by respective agency or authority head. As provided in the budget, the Regional Council capital fund was awarded by ESD in its discretion.

This process resulted in funding of projects that aligned with a long term, regionally generated implementation agendas and are capable of stimulating economic growth and investment.

On December 19, 2012, the Governor announced that 725 projects totaling \$738 million had been awarded through Round Two of the Regional Economic Development Council initiative. Best Plan awards were given to Central New York, Mid Hudson, Southern Tier, North Country and Finger Lakes in adherence to the competition guidelines detailed above.

# **Assessment of the 2012 Progress Report**

# **Part One: Strategic Plan Update**

## **Building on the 2011 Strategic Plan**

#### A. Addressing weaknesses identified in the 2011 assessments

The Southern Tier Regional Economic Development Council (STREDC) plan update clearly addressed 5 of the 7 weaknesses identified in the 2011 assessments. Progress was made on providing specific implementation steps and timelines, and in nurturing projects to support job creation. Additional performance measures for priority projects implemented in 2012 were identified, and the impacts were provided. For 2012 proposed priority projects, expected outcomes are listed.

The STREDC also addressed a weakness related to energy strategies by identifying three projects related to energy efficiency and renewable energy technology. In addition, 8 other projects are listed as requesting NYSERDA funding.

Weaknesses not clearly addressed related to: leveraging from non-state sources and source of leveraging dollars.

### B. Building upon strengths identified in the 2011 assessment

The STREDC continues to be committed to its vision that capitalizes on its assets, is forward-looking and provides guidance and direction for its strategic action plan." The strategies remain largely as presented in the 2011 strategic plan and continue to build on the region's strengths.

## **Strategies**

The 2011 strategic plan had five strategies – each with two or more action areas - to support growth in the Southern Tier:

Strategy 1: NY's Leader in Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy Technology

Strategy 2: Transportation Industry...The Next Generation Technology and Advanced Manufacturing

Strategy 3: Health Care 2020

Strategy 4: Revitalize the Rural Farm and Forest-Based Economy

Strategy 5: Economic Development Backbone

The STREDC did not add any new strategic objectives or alter any of its five strategies in 2012. However, the STREDC did add new action areas under three strategic objectives: Health Care 2020, Revitalize the Rural Farm and Forest-Based Economy, and Economic Development Backbone. There are no gaps between strategies identified as priorities and the actions included as priorities in 2012-13; all are clearly tied to a strategy (p. 8).

The 2012 progress report explains very clearly why projects, actions, and policies were identified as priorities. For example, the Southern Tier High Technology Incubator (p. 29) is discussed as supporting 4

of the 5 strategies: energy, transportation, health care, and economic development backbone. Where appropriate, projected job impacts are noted.

The 2012 progress report documents a more focused strategic approach around rural initiatives, infrastructure for shovel ready sites, and community revitalization; and it provides a much more extensive set of priority project proposals.

# **Implementation Agenda**

The implementation agenda was effective at identifying specific actions to be taken to implement chosen strategies, deadlines, and responsible parties; although in some cases the extent of STREDC involvement is unclear.

Priority projects have a clear relationship to one or more strategies, and most projects use a combination of State and other funding. The STREDC plans to broaden its strategic scope in 2012-2013 by developing projects in all 5 strategic areas. This approach is consistent with the implementation agenda in the 2011 strategic plan.

Project readiness was a strong consideration in selection of priority projects proposed for funding in 2012; the project selection criteria awarded 20% of the total points to the criterion "demonstrates measurable impact in 5 years."

The agenda does not include actions related to non-state funded projects or activities. All actions are associated with a funded CFA.

# **Part Two: Progress Made Implementing Strategies**

# **Progress**

#### A. Organizational progress

The STREDC appointed an Executive Committee and used numerous other work groups as a source of knowledge and ideas, including work groups on agriculture, energy, health care, infrastructure, technology development and transfer, tourism, downtown community revitalization, business development, data, and workforce development. The role of the work groups in influencing policies, identifying priority projects, and implementing strategies is not clear.

A major focus of the STREDC was development of a pipeline process for identifying projects and actions that help advance the strategies in the strategic plan. The STREDC and staff engaged in active outreach to municipalities, community organizations, economic development agencies, regional planning boards, colleges and universities, Cornell Cooperative Extension offices and the work groups. STREDC actively encouraged project sponsors to apply for funding through the 2012 CFA, and reviewed concept papers and presentations on prospective projects to make sure each had the ability to support and quickly advance the strategies. Priority Project Selection Criteria was used to select priority projects for endorsement.

The STREDC also established 3 initiatives in 2012, which were funded with ESD capital funds, developing a process and criteria for selecting projects for funding.

#### B. Examples of progress

STREDC reports that the 55 CFA projects from Round 1 created 1,385 jobs, retained 1,075 jobs, and leveraged additional investment of \$132.3 million. The STREDC implemented all projects and initiatives that received Capital Funding and Excelsior Tax Credits in Year 1. This included closing on all loans and grants issued through three new community funds.

The community funds were created to incorporate flood recovery from Hurricane Irene and Tropical Storm Lee into the broader regional strategy. By July of 2012 all three initiatives began funding local projects. By September of 2012 the funds had been fully utilized. For example, a farmer's market in Broome County should break ground shortly, in support of the rural economy; shovel-ready site development is being supported through freight rail improvements in Bath and from Corning to the Pennsylvania state line; and community revitalization is underway in both Roxbury and Watkins Glen. Two of the funds are loan programs, allowing proceeds to seed future projects.

The progress report lists impacts for all three of the initial focus areas.

- The Rural Initiative Fund received \$3.5 million in requests for funding which leveraged \$7.1 million in private investment, and will create an estimated 150 new jobs.
- The Shovel Ready infrastructure Fund awarded \$2.5 million which leveraged \$5.8 million in private investment, and created 50 construction jobs, with potential long-term impacts of 1,000 jobs and \$250 million in private investment.
- The Community Revitalization Fund received requests for \$5.3 million in funding and leveraged \$11.1 million in private investment, resulting in 14 building renovations and creation of 20 new housing units.

There is no evidence presented that the region demonstrated progress implementing strategies through non-state funded actions (e.g. local law changes, community groups adopted park, developer provided waterfront access).

# **Leveraging of Resources**

For 2012-13, the STREDC proposed to use ESD capital funds to leverage \$460 million in non-State funds to support its priority projects. Sixteen of 24 projects had some degree of leverage, although the private funding sources were not well documented.

The STREDC formed several partnerships with non-State entities to provide technical assistance, staff expertise, or institutional resources, including: the Broome County Industrial Development Agency, Cornell Cooperative Extension, the Steuben County IDA, and the Wellsboro & Corning Railroad. Additional partnerships would be established in connection with proposed 2012 priority projects.

Leverageable assets were not identified in 2011 projects, however the two revolving loan programs (Rural Initiative and Community Revitalization) allow loan repayments to fund future projects.

## **Performance Measures**

The STREDC uses performance measures to monitor and measure performance against objectives. The STREDC receives a performance report at each of its meetings, although it is unclear who develops the report. Measurable results are reported for each 2011 CFA project, as well as their impact.

Performance measures are used to track performance of projects funded under the three focus initiatives: Rural Initiatives, Shovel Ready sites infrastructure, and Community Revitalization. Applicants funded through the community funds are required by contracts to report performance measures and to meet MWBE goals.

Performance measures also form the criteria used by the STREDC as the basis for evaluation and final ranking of the 2012 Priority Projects. These measures are in four categories: supports sustainable economic development, demonstrates measurable impact in 5 years, promotes vibrant communities and overall quality of life, and creates distinctive niches and promotes regionalism.

# **Process**

The progress report lists several public outreach activities undertaken in 2012 to ensure public participation, including STREDC meetings, a website, presentations and public forums, the project development process, Cornell Cooperative Extension outreach, and media releases. The work groups are also a means of involving the public.

Other than the involvement of over 200 people in the work groups, the report did not document the extent of these activities or the resulting degree of public participation.
