Garry Douglas opened the session at 1:37 p.m.

Garry Douglas welcomed everyone and highlighted the council's work during today's meeting, including:

- Finalized the application process for the Infrastructure Fund for water and sewer projects that are ready to go this year. Every local government will be notified.
- Endorsed a general permit process before the APA for sustainably managed forests.
- Heard about status of many of the projects in year 1 and 2.
- Announcement of a third year competition, but waiting for information. CFA applications may be submitted up to a month earlier. Scoring may be done over the summer, with announcements by end of the year.

Garry Douglas said the council discussed apprenticeship opportunities in the region and its desire to see them used. Lt. Gov. will return to Albany and bring back guidance.

Working groups should continue their efforts.

Carl McLaughlin – The Federal budget has been released. The Department of Defense announced possibly two more rounds of Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC). While closure of Fort Drum is not a primary concern, DOD is going through a programmatic review on future force strength with 125,000 soldiers in play. DOD stated a need to reduce from 21 installations and 80,000 soldiers nationwide. There are two options, and Ft. Drum could end up with more soldiers under Option 2. DOD is considering adding three battalions (up to 3,000 more soldiers) to Fort Drum. The post's economic impact study has been done. The Army has announced that Tuesday, April 23, will be a listening date at

Case High School in Watertown for community to respond to the practical impact of what would happen to Ft. Drum if BRAC and reduction of soldier strength occurred.
