New York State Council on the Arts – Arts and Culture Initiatives

Q1. What is the total amount of funding available?

A1. Up to \$5 million for the Arts and Cultural Program Initiatives and up to \$1.75 million for the New York State Council on the Arts (REDC) Arts and Cultural Facilities Improvement Program – Mid-Size Capital Fund.

Q2. Is there a regional breakdown for available funding?

A2. Not in summary form. However, you can look up all our past funded REDC projects by county and other criteria on our Past Grants Section: http://www.nysca.org/grant_app/org_search.cfm

Q3. If an organization eliminated a position due to budget costs, can they apply for a grant with the NYS Council of Arts and use the funding to fund a new position?

A3. Yes, but the organization will have to make a strong case for how it will sustain that position into the future once the subsidy has been spent.

Q4. If we receive general operating support from NYSCA can we apply?

A4. Yes, as long as the proposed activity is above and beyond the organization's regular, ongoing programming.

Q5. Does the grant pay through a reimbursement process?

A5. NYSCA REDC Initiatives grants under \$50,000 are paid up front, while Initiatives grants over \$50,000 are paid in installments. Capital facilities grants are paid in installments, with the final portion of the grant paid once the majority of the work is completed.

Q6. Are there limits to the grant amount?

A6. Yes. Grant award limits vary by category. Please review our guidelines to verify grant limits for each category.

Q7. What are the REDC Goals and does my application need to address them as related to my project?

A7. Successful projects may demonstrate significant economic and community development impact to serve:

- Develop workforce, engage new audiences
- Revitalize neighborhoods
- Generate collaborative projects
- Drive and support tourism
- Enhance resources for underserved communities

This is not an exhaustive list. Please also be sure to review the CFA Resource Manual and your specific regional council's priorities and goals.

Q8. What if the application does not fall into one of the three Initiatives categories? (Council on the Arts - NY State Arts Impact Awards, Council on the Arts – Workforce Investment, Council on the Arts – Workforce Fellowship Program)

A8. You cannot apply to the Initiatives if your project does not fall into one of these categories, though organizations with facilities projects may also apply to the Mid-Size Capital Fund.

Q9. Are organizations only eligible to apply for one opportunity?

A9. Organizations may apply to NYSCA for one REDC initiatives category and one facilities fund.

More specifically:

Organizations may only apply to one of the three NYSCA-REDC Initiatives categories:

Council on the Arts – NY State Arts Impact Awards

Council on the Arts – Workforce Investment

Council on the Arts – Workforce Fellowship Program

Organizations may serve as a partner on additional applications, but may only be the lead applicant on ONE application. Organizations that have received NYSCA-REDC Workforce Investment funding may apply for a renewal if they received funding in Round 8. Organizations that have received NYSCA-REDC Workforce Investment funding in Rounds 7 or earlier may apply for a new grant for a new position or expansion of a REDC funded part time position to full time. Organizations that have received NYSCA-REDC Workforce Readiness funding in Rounds 7 & 8 are eligible to apply for a renewal grant in the Workforce Fellowship Program category.

Additionally, applicants may also make one application in the NYSCA Arts and Cultural Facilities Improvement Program – Mid-Size Capital Fund. Organizations that have already received 2017 or 2018 Arts and Cultural Facilities Improvement Program Funding are ineligible to apply for capital improvement opportunity through REDC.

Q10. Can I apply for an REDC-NYSCA grant to support a *project* that also receives support through another NYSCA program (or has an application pending)?

A10. No. Current and previous NYSCA grantees may apply for support through the REDC, but it must be for a project that has not already been funded by the agency.

Q11. Can we apply if the project has already started?

A11. You can apply if it is an ongoing multiyear program, however NYSCA funds can only cover expenses incurred during the grant contract period. Note - the proposed project cannot be part of any other current NYSCA program request or funded grant. Be sure the request submitted meets the specific requirements for the NYSCA REDC category you are applying under.

Q12. Do the matching funds have to be in place before we apply and can they be from other government sources?

A12. Secured matches are required for the NY State Arts Impact Awards, and the Mid-Size Capital Fund. While each funding opportunity varies in terms of match requirements, the most competitive applications will have the match at hand, or firm commitments for the match by the time the application is submitted.

Funds from any other state agency (e.g. I LOVE NY Matching Funds, ESD or other NYSCA funds) are not eligible to be used for the match. Other sources of government funding such as New York City grants can be used towards the match.

Q13. Is there funding available for past REDC Initiatives grant recipients?

A13. Organizations that received NYSCA-REDC Workforce Investment funding in Round 8 or Readiness funding in Rounds 7 or 8 are eligible to apply in the same category again through renewal opportunities (outlined below), or they may elect to apply to a different category instead. All other previous grantees may apply to any category.

Council on the Arts – Workforce Investment Round 8 recipients can apply for a one-year renewal. Recipients from Rounds 7 or earlier may apply for entire new positions, or for the expansion of a Workforce Investment-funded part-time position to full time.

Council on the Arts – Workforce Readiness Rounds 7 & 8 recipients may apply for a one-year renewal to the Council on the Arts – Workforce Fellowship Program

Past recipients of Arts and Cultural Impact Programming awards may reapply to the NY State Arts Impact Awards category, but may only do so with a different project.

Q14. Are there any legacy opportunities for past NYSCA REDC planning grant recipients?

A14. No.

NY State Arts Impact Awards

Q15. Can we apply with a new project?

A15. No, applicants may only apply to expand a project that already has a proven track record.

Q16. What qualifies as "expansion" of a project?

A16. Expansion for this award means to either extend the life of a public arts project, or expand its reach to another region, or broader audience.

Q17. Can I apply for expansion of a project that received NYSCA-REDC funding previously?

A17. No, projects that have previously received any NYSCA support are not eligible for funding in this REDC round.

Workforce Investment

Q18. What is the operating budget limit for organizations applying in the Workforce Investment focus area?

A18. For the administrative and artistic staff positions, the applicant's overall operational budget may not exceed \$3,000,000 (as determined by the audit or financial statement provided in the

organization's Grants Gateway Document Vault at the time of application). There is no limit on the organizational budget size for applications submitted for the Resident Artist focus area.

Q19. What percent of a Workforce Investment grant should support salary?

A19. Grant awards in this category are ONLY to subsidize a hire's direct salary. All positions funded by a NYSCA-REDC Workforce Investment grant must be hourly or salaried employees of the organization (no contract-based or seasonal employment).

Q20. Is the list of positions supported by the Workforce Investment grants on the website exhaustive?

A20. No. You may apply for support for other positions beyond those listed here.

Q21. Can the Workforce Investment funds be used to support a part-time position?

A21. The funds can support the expansion of existing part-time to full-time, or the creation of new positions that are either part or full time.

Q22. Can the organization request funding for non-payroll staff, like consultants?

A22. No. The request can only be for a staff member that is on payroll, not independent contractors and/or seasonal staff. It can be for a staff that is new and will be on payroll.

Q23. Is there a minimum number of jobs that need to be created or expanded through the Workforce Investment category?

A23. A Workforce Investment grant is to fund a single position.

Q24. Does the organization have to apply with a particular individual for a resident artist position?

A24. Yes. If you are applying for a Resident Artist position you must have already engaged an artist with whom you will apply. If you are applying for new Administrative or Artistic Positions, you do not need to identify a candidate before applying

Q25. Would a project allowing an artist to educate and teach young children fall under a Workforce Investment grant?

A25. Yes, it would support this position.

NYSCA REDC Arts Workforce Fellowship Program

Q26. What is the minimum number of professionals that need to participate in Arts Workforce Fellowship program?

A26. In every case the grant must cover direct costs associated with the proposed program intended to benefit *two or more* participants. The proposed program must provide training and educational opportunities for all of the participants and/or mentorship for the fellows.

Q27. What do you mean by "underrepresented communities"?

A27. Underrepresented communities encompass minority populations and individuals from communities that have been historically underrepresented in arts organizations because of educational and economic disadvantage and ethnic background. We understand that "underrepresented" will have a different meaning region by region, and we expect applicants to define that in their application narrative.

Q28. Is career training intended to be entry level?

A28. Not necessarily, but the curriculum and professional experience offered should be appropriate to the level of the fellows the organization is recruiting.

Q29. Is it possible to request Workforce Fellowship funds for internships?

A29. Only if coupled with a well-articulated curriculum training component.
