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

MESSAGE FROM CO-CHAIRS



REGIONAL VISION

Building on a strong foundation of target industries, higher education institutions, the nonprofit sector, and government agencies, the Southern Tier (ST) will take a collaborative, regional approach to attract talent and investment for the development of industry clusters, especially advanced manufacturing, healthcare, food and agriculture, and tourism. A particular focus will be on increasing the size, quality, and prosperity of the region's workforce through new business creation based on high-technology discoveries and other entrepreneurial activities, while ensuring healthy communities and protecting the region's natural beauty and resources. The ST's regional plan for economic development is driven by research and public engagement, with consideration of demographics and economics of the ST as well as input from industry and academic leaders, experts in their fields, and residents. As the initiatives described in this strategic plan become realized, the ST will no longer be just a region in upstate New York—it will be a hotbed of vigorous business growth and development and a destination for the next generations of the nation's best and brightest talent.

Transform the Food and Agriculture Industry

The ST will be a world-recognized leader in agriculture technology and serve as a key food supplier for the East Coast of the United States. A strategic mix of projects will transform and grow agriculture and food production, processing, and distribution across the region, while also strengthening links to growing tourism and manufacturing industries.

Promote the Southern Tier's Innovative Culture

The ST will be a well-recognized and highly desirable place to visit, live, and grow a business. We will promote the region's quality of life and capacity for innovation and ignite a fierce community pride that compels residents to be regional ambassadors to attract talent and inspire entrepreneurs.

Develop Tourism Business in the Southern Tier

In addition to being a desirable place to live and work, the ST has a treasure trove of natural and cultural amenities to attract visitors. To maximize their attractiveness, the amenities need to be enhanced by a more robust regional promotional campaign, better wayfinding signage, and a well-trained tourism and hospitality workforce that delivers an unforgettable travel experience.

Regional Priorities

BUILD THE GREATER BINGHAMTON INNOVATION ECOSYSTEM

Greater Binghamton will be a destination for talent, new business development and partnerships for commercialization of emerging technologies. Revitalized urban centers in Binghamton, Johnson City and Endicott will maintain the area's legacy and position it as a major gateway, with strengths in advanced manufacturing, healthcare, arts and culture, and high-technology development. Innovation Districts will capitalize on public-private collaborations and the growing presence of Binghamton University.

According to the Brookings Institute, Innovation Districts, or "iDistricts" are "geographic areas where leading-edge anchor institutions and companies cluster and connect with start-ups, business incubators, and accelerators. They are also physically

compact, transit-accessible, and technically-wired and offer mixed-use housing, office, and retail." Greater Binghamton has three unique, physically compact and transit-accessible downtown districts — Endicott, Johnson City, and Binghamton — that are united by common waterways, transportation networks and anchor institutions. Through the recent creation of iDistricts in these urban cores, the ST REDC will support efforts to encourage dense development where leading-edge anchor institutions and companies can cluster and connect with start-ups, business incubators and accelerators to become drivers of a new advanced economy in the iDistricts and beyond.

The region has a rich history of innovation and business development in emerging industries, but to remain competitive in the global market, the region must focus on high-tech and high-value production

that can build on both historical and more recent regional strengths including defense, aerospace, transportation, health-related technology, and clean energy. Part of this effort must include a focus on closing the skills gap by developing the available workforce to fill current open jobs as well as jobs where demand is projected to grow.

One opportunity that the ST REDC has identified includes the more than 63,000 students annually who are educated at the ST's colleges and universities. These students and associated institutions represent a powerful research, teaching, training and networking engine that can accelerate the region's local innovation economies.

Additionally, recent investments in the area, including the BU Health Sciences Campus and Century Sunrise Apartments in Johnson City, Koffman Southern Tier Incubator and Buckingham Manufacturing, Inc. in Binghamton, and Charge C4V/IM3NY in Endicott, can act as a catalyst for additional investment, amplifying the economic impact and creating opportunities to grow the innovation ecosystem around the three iDistricts.

To maintain the Greater Binghamton Ecosystem's legacy as an innovation hub and position it to capitalize on recent investments in the three iDistricts, The ST REDC Greater Binghamton Work Group will support efforts that:

- Build upon the three Innovation Districts that will become drivers of a new advanced economy in Greater Binghamton: the City of Binghamton iDistrict, the Johnson City Health and Cultural iDistrict and the Endicott Advanced Manufacturing iDistrict;
- Continue to support projects that build upon investments made through the Greater Binghamton Fund, specifically projects focusing on affordable as well as market rate housing targeting working families and professionals, the arts, restaurant and retail establishments as well as service providers supporting iDistrict employers and employees;
- Focus on opportunities for minority and women-owned business to attract, promote, and invest in companies with diverse ownership, management and staffing profiles;
- Support investments in regional strengths in advanced manufacturing, healthcare, culture and high-technology development;

- Leverage and support the R&D capabilities of academia and industry in the region, giving ST companies a competitive edge, attracting new jobs and creating opportunities for a reinvigorated workforce;
- Advance New York State initiatives, particularly workforce development and increased access to affordable childcare and transportation options, that address issues that currently limit the region's ability to fill open jobs and keep qualified employees;
- Connect more businesses, property owners, and organizations to resources that enable them to thrive in the Greater Binghamton ecosystem;
- Make the iDistricts truly Innovation Districts by bolstering Wi-Fi access, creating flexible co-working spaces, provide EV charging stations, and incorporating "Smart City" strategies;
- Continue to focus on bolstering the three iDistricts while emphasizing the need to focus on projects that improve the corridors between all three iDistricts; and
- Prioritize cultural institutions not only as economic drivers but as economic magnets, creating the type of community that people are drawn to. While science and technology related industries remain a major focus, Greater Binghamton has seen the benefits of nurturing an arts and creative cluster as well. To that end we must make sure our arts and entertainment outlets (theaters, museums, galleries) are supported and nurtured back to full operating status and tended to so they can grow and flourish beyond pre-pandemic levels.

One recent effort includes implementation of the \$20 Million Greater Binghamton Fund to facilitate key economic development projects in Binghamton, Johnson City and Endicott as outlined in the Southern Tier Soaring plan.

The ST REDC, under the guidance and implementation efforts of the Greater Binghamton work group, will support the region's efforts to promote advanced manufacturing, entrepreneurial activities, workforce development efforts and quality of life as it relates to the Greater Binghamton innovation ecosystem. Because Binghamton University is a major economic driver not only in Binghamton, but in all three iDistricts and the Greater Binghamton area, the ST REDC will also continue to support the university as it improves

its academic profile, grows its research portfolio, extends its economic reach and improves the overall academic experience for its students.

Greater Binghamton Work Group will also strive for prosperity and participation for all residents. Prosperity in all sectors of society is necessary for overall community success. Initiatives should enhance choice, opportunity, and mobility for all so that individuals and families are not confined to particular economic and geographic boundaries due to race, income, age, gender or physical ability. Recognition of the varying needs in housing, entrepreneurship, employment, childcare, transportation, and social services, among others, is key to supporting the diversity and inclusivity that make our iDistricts unique.

INVEST IN THE ADVANCED MANUFACTURING INDUSTRY

The ST REDC is focused on advanced manufacturing and the startup ecosystem; in particular, the growing transportation, clean energy, industrial hemp, and adult-use cannabis industry sectors, that will elevate the ST as a destination for manufacturing business and supply chain development. Distinguished by its concentration of multi-national anchor companies, infrastructure to support innovation and technology, rich education and research resources, specialized skilled workforce, and vibrant communities, the ST is poised to become a national leader in manufacturing. The REDC is further committed to bringing recognition of the region and New York State as a leader in innovation and integration of battery technology and the energy storage sector as a major component of Governor Cuomo's Reforming the Energy Vision strategy and the industrial hemp sector as a key component of New York State's growing leadership role in this agriculture and manufacturing sector

In the clean energy sector, a major challenge is the global race for development and application of battery technology in multiple arenas ranging from personal autos and last mile delivery trucks, to transportation initiatives being undertaken by UBER, avionics, military application, and locally made products such as forklifts. The battery technology business sector currently is dominated by Asian markets, and an investment in the U.S. presence is paramount in this major industrial wave. NYS's commitment to clean energy together with its leading R&D efforts positions it well as a potential magnet for business development. There also will be a need to address long-term challenges with the development of battery recycling businesses. Projects such as the IM3NY lithium ion

battery manufacturing facility in Broome County demonstrate a commitment to this effort. At the same time, the rapid growth in energy storage projects is resulting in an increasing demand for a strong and qualified supply chain. The ST REDC supports a goal of having more locally manufactured products integrate battery technology into their design and manufacture.

New York State established its leadership role in hemp processing with the nation's first government investment in a processing facility in the ST. It will be important to continue major investments such as this and develop businesses in order to maintain this leadership position in a highly competitive and growing business sector and to leverage opportunity in newly approved adult and medical use cannabis sector.

Manufacturing in the ST remained surprisingly resilient during the COVID-19 pandemic. With most deemed as "essential" facilities, many small to mid-size manufacturers experienced growth in 2020. It is vitally important to maintain this level of growth and opportunity in a post-pandemic economy, especially if we want to bolster the domestic supply chain.

The ST REDC Advanced Manufacturing Work Group seeks to support efforts that power the growth and development of the advanced manufacturing industry in the ST and that:

- Build resilience in the manufacturing sector including a vibrant workforce pipeline for skilled workers while at the same time providing education on the use of automation to create efficiencies and maintain productivity;
- Focus investments on growing small to mid-size enterprises (SMEs), that buoy the regional manufacturing economy;
- Include high levels of R&D and commitment to innovation in emerging technologies;
- Continuously recharge the skills pipeline and attract STEM workers, with a focus on creating an experienced workforce necessary to support growing demand in advanced manufacturing;
- Strengthen the advanced manufacturing ecosystem, especially in the growth of the domestic supply chain;
- Advance New York State initiatives including Global NY, Start-Up NY, Hot Spots, Opportunity Agenda, Manufacturing Industry Cluster Program, Veterans Initiative, NY Rising and NYSTAR;

- Build and promote New York State’s comprehensive clean energy strategy and contribute to achievement of Reforming the Energy Vision (REV) goals with development of a regional economic development strategy that includes development and application of clean energy innovation and also grows New York’s clean energy economy through business growth, new business attraction and largescale renewable energy development; and
- Enhance New York State’s national leadership role in the industrial hemp sector with application of R&D in production and new product development, development of industrial hemp processing facilities and related supply chain development, building the foundation of a prosperous adult-use cannabis manufacturing base and connecting to latest research and development at area colleges and universities.

To accomplish this, the ST REDC has identified the following approaches to help implement their regional strategy:

- Address the workforce shortage in manufacturing by creating a more proactive apprenticeship network and leveraging funds to aid businesses;
- Leverage recent NYS investments in battery technology manufacturing and energy storage;
- Incentivize financial investment by regional businesses undertaking projects that involve application of battery technology in both the production of existing products as well as commercialization of R&D in new product development;
- Identify infrastructure, site work, and capital improvements required to support business growth in energy technology, renewable energy, and other industrial sectors; and
- Complete a comprehensive regional supply chain analysis to identify gaps or to assist in “match making” smaller regional suppliers with larger companies;
- Educate young people about manufacturing jobs in our region and work to change the perception that all manufacturing jobs are low-skilled or low-wage jobs.

More specifically, the ST REDC Advanced Manufacturing Work Group will build off efforts from the past several years and strive to implement an ambitious action plan over the next year that:

- Leverages investments by NYS in the ST including energy storage projects, battery technology development and battery manufacturing;
- Stimulates demand among its corporate drivers that will propel the need for new businesses involved in the application of battery technology (such as Amphenol Aerospace and AIO, BAE, Corning Incorporated, Ensco Avionics, Lockheed, Raymond Corporation, NextEra, Invenergy and Calpine);
- Meets demand for qualified supply chain businesses ranging from sourcing battery packs to systems integration to recycling;
- Fills gaps in demand for time-to-market supply for new mobile and stationary applications, such as taxis;
- Increases R&D and commercialization of new technology for application in both the private and military sectors; and
- Leverages R&D in the region’s universities and private firms

TRANSFORM THE FOOD AND AGRICULTURE INDUSTRY

With more than \$5 Billion in output, the ST’s agrifood sector represents a significant part of its economy with vast potential to expand production built on the region’s expertise in food production. With its 1.1 Million acres of farmland, its abundant fresh water, its proximity to key East Coast markets, and the global reach and strengths of Cornell University’s College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, the ST is well-positioned to continue supporting a strong agrifood sector. As traditional centers of agriculture production outside of the Northeast face production challenges due to draught, natural resource scarcity, and the visibility of supply chain vulnerability exposed during the COVID-19 pandemic, the ST has an opportunity to scale up production to meet demand for food products within New York and throughout the Northeast through developments in plant science technology, controlled environment agriculture, robotics and automation, distribution and storage technology, and renewable energy.

Despite the resiliency food and agricultural players have demonstrated in continuing to supply food and other necessities during the ongoing crisis, the COVID-19 pandemic nonetheless revealed our food system’s

fault lines here in the ST. There is an even greater urgency to understand the common limits in the region's agriculture, processing, and distribution sectors. To that end, in 2020 the ST REDC Food and Agriculture Work Group participated in a needs assessment produced as a collaboration between the Center of Excellence for Food and Agriculture (COE) and the Center for Regional Economic Advancement (CREA) at Cornell University. Based on nearly 100 interviews with farmers, food and beverage manufacturers, food distributors, food retailers, researchers, academics, extension specialists, policymakers, and trade associations conducted in Q4 of 2020 and Q1 of 2021, the resulting report indicated that the ST should adopt the following agrifood strategies to support its intermediate growth and long-term strength:

1. Increase local and regional agrifood supply chain responsiveness and resilience to take the ST from being a highly seasonal, occasional provider of food products to being a reliable and heavily utilized source of supply for the East Coast.

Although consumer demand for local and sustainable food has never been higher, ST growers, makers, distributors, and food retailers said that managing a transparent supply chain is a constant challenge. End-to-end logistics for small to midsize farms, transportation, cold-chain technology, and traceability tools are all desired, as are increased access to food processing facilities, including slaughterhouses, meatpacking and poultry processing facilities, dairy processing facilities and aseptic packaging facilities for vegetables.

There additionally needs to be a reckoning that the consumer is now a part of the supply chain; the pandemic has provided an opportunity for more farmers to sell directly to their consumers, which brings better profit margins, but also brings new challenges, such as managing customer relationships, keeping track of inventory, reaching customers, and filling orders. E-commerce platforms that help farmers sell more easily to customers online, streamline their marketing operations, and help connect farmers and buyers in their region would address these challenges.

Efficient controlled environment agriculture (CEA) offers a longer growing season, increased crop diversity, decreased use of pesticides, and increased access to local foods throughout the year. By implementing best practices in green energy solutions for heating and lighting, it can be efficiently and quickly integrated into the ST's agrifood economy.

Finally, a strengthened connection between the ST and the New York City market will allow small farms to distribute their product to a larger market. The ST can leverage its location at the crossroads of upstate New York via the creation of a "food hub" network that facilitates market connections and distribution of food products for production centers in regions across the state.

All of these initiatives require increased broadband and cellular connectivity and digital skills development to assist local farms, farm businesses, food processors, distributors, and retail locations in greater access to online sales, connection and marketing.

2. Incentivize new agrifood venture creation to spur innovative technology solutions to common grower and producer constraints, delivering higher yields and drawing participation from people of all ages, races, sexual orientations, and national origins.

By attracting global attention to the region's intellectual, agricultural, industrial, and natural resources, the Grow-NY food and agriculture business competition has embedded novel agrifood activity within the already robust ST innovation ecosystem, catalyzing new business activity and stimulating sector growth. Continued funding will foster significant direct and indirect job creation and the multiplying effect of property, sales, and income tax revenues, as well as the enrichment of the ecosystem itself.

Making additional support in the forms of business plan development and access to capital available to producers who seek to innovate and enhance resiliency, especially in the space of overlap with climate tech, will put the ST at the vanguard of key areas of emerging agrifood growth and investment such as CEA, robotics and automation, novel crop protection, and supply chain technology. Identifying and shoring up pipelines to educational and practical experiences will address the narrow participant demographics of the current agrifood system by nurturing agricultural professionals from diverse backgrounds.

3. Cultivate workforce adaptability by modernizing farm and food production activities.

Growing agrifood labor needs in tension with immediate labor shortages and a shrinking labor market compound the challenges faced by farmers and food producers in the ST. Lack of affordable labor threatens the economic viability of farms, particularly dairy farms and some specialty crop farms that require significantly more labor to harvest their crops. Solutions to boost harvest efficiency, pest and disease identification, and other field management data are also urgently needed, but the high costs of the equipment, marginal profitability on most farms, and access to adequate information about new technologies result in innovative solutions being peripheral to most NY farmers' operations.

By focusing development in emerging technology sectors such as CEA, robotics and automation, novel crop protection, and supply chain technology, and by supporting those sectors with infrastructure such as expanded broadband and cellular coverage and farm- and workplace-safety best management plan implementation, the ST can provide workforce opportunity to people from urban and suburban backgrounds without experience in traditional land-based agricultural sciences.

4. Drive farming profitability by encouraging crop diversification and supporting processing infrastructure for value-addition.

The ST's climate is suited to hemp/cannabis production, and with investment in processing and manufacturing capabilities, the state could be home to innovation in this market. Hemp grown for food, fiber, and industrial applications has tremendous potential. Innovations in alternative applications for hemp as a biomaterial and biofuel hold

significant interest, as well as sustainable bioproducts made from hemp or other agricultural crops, and potential industrial and consumer applications for hemp, such as biopolymers, nanocellulose, nutraceuticals, food and beverage, textiles, paper, building materials, and animal nutrition. In addition, as the State develops rules related to the recent legalization of adult-use cannabis, the agriculture industry in the ST could potentially benefit from this opportunity.

In addition to the opportunities associated with hemp and cannabis crops, other high-potential crops such as chickpeas and oats with heavy utilization in powerful "better for you" consumer packaged goods, such as animal-free ingredients, functional snacks, and paleo/keto foods, are suitable for integration into the fabric of ST farms.

While supporting growers interested in adopting these crops with planting and harvesting technology is important, the ST also needs processing and storage equipment that will make utilization of these crops complete.

PROMOTE THE SOUTHERN TIER'S INNOVATIVE CULTURE

The ST is a well-recognized and highly desirable place to learn, visit, live, and work. The region's distinct combination of educational strength, culture, innovation, leisure-related industries, and natural resources creates a lifestyle that couples the convenience of larger cities with opportunities to lead a healthy lifestyle surrounded by natural beauty.

Looking beyond the COVID-19 pandemic, the long-term continuation of the innovative culture of the ST will heavily rely on the successes in addressing our short-term needs. Continued funding, growth, and support of innovation programs that, in turn, support new venture formation and development, will be necessary. Targeted investments in infrastructure such as expansion of high-speed broadband and 5G cellular service will serve as the foundations upon which all other innovation is built.

The long-term needs of the ST's innovative culture are:

- Continue and grow existing innovation programs while incorporating new opportunities for "match-making" of entrepreneurs to one another, to support organizations, and to providers of capital through multiple programs and channels;

- Explore and launch new programs that nationally and internationally promote the ST as an active innovation hotspot; and
- Retain and attract residents and student talent who add to the vibrancy and workforce of the region.

The ST REDC Innovative Culture Work Group strives to further develop a high quality of life for residents and visitors by creating and supporting an environment that welcomes new, innovative ideas and promotes them, along with existing assets, within and outside of the region. The ST has significant innovation assets in both corporate and academic research and development, as well as in a highly educated population. Yet, these assets consistently remain underutilized in new company formation, commercialization, and technology transfer. A regional approach advances the goal to better use existing assets to increase the pace of commercialization and the success rate of new startups.

To continue building the ST's profile as a highly desirable place to learn, visit, live, and grow a business, the ST REDC will support efforts that:

- Strengthen the region's tourism, community, and natural resource assets and use them to promote the region to visitors, new residents, prospective talent and investors – including staycations;
- Ensure high-quality infrastructure for remote workers, including but not limited to universal broadband and adoption of 5G cellular service;
- Strengthen efforts to create appropriate housing stock for new residents, workers and business owners;
- Strengthen and promote support for services that are critical for today and tomorrow's workforce including quality childcare; continuous learning opportunities for existing workers, new entrants in the labor pool, and retirees; and creation of co-working spaces through-out our communities;
- Advance commercialization of technology by maximizing innovation and intellectual capital among private-sector and academic institutions (the Southern Tier Startup Alliance takes a leading role in implementing this strategy); and
- Attract and nurture a critical mass of entrepreneurs by promoting the commercialization of research from the region's sources of innovation, retaining college graduates, and continuing to cultivate the regional entrepreneurial ecosystem comprising

attractive and welcoming communities, incubators, seed capital, and support services.

To accomplish this, the ST REDC has identified the following approaches to help implement their regional strategy:

- Continued investment in innovation clusters across the ST will have a long-lasting impact on building an ecosystem of companies, innovation, and job growth;
- Continued development of sources of capital for startups in the region;
- Focus on innovation clusters in clean energy, food and agriculture, and advanced manufacturing/ materials through signature competition programs, such as Grow-NY, and initiatives that support manufacturing and hardware development;
- Leveraging our higher education institutions across the region to lead efforts that support innovation and help spur local economic development;
- Expanding broadband and achieving "last-mile" coverage in the region to increase quality of life, improve educational outcomes, and make these areas more attractive to live and start a business; and
- Providing support to revitalize all communities, regardless of size, throughout the Region, and assisting these communities in their efforts to improve existing housing stock and create adequate housing for new residents.

More specifically, the ST REDC Innovative Culture Work Group will build off efforts from the past several years and strive to implement an ambitious action plan over the next year by focusing on complementary strategies. First, in order to continue attracting young professionals, the REDC must be positioned to offer high-quality jobs and quality of life. The ST boasts quality education, neighborhoods, outdoors activities, and cultural events year-round. There are ample opportunities to further provide an environment that supports entrepreneurs and attracts companies that will create the jobs young professionals are looking for.

Over the past year, progress has been made in achieving these goals. Specifically, ST incubators are working collaboratively to leverage resources and support regional entrepreneurs through the Southern Tier Startup Alliance. The Southern Tier Startup Alliance, the region's NYSTAR-designated and funded Innovation Hot Spot, is a member organization of the

region's incubators. In 2020, the ST Startup Alliance increased the connections of regional startups to capital, and increased deal flow for investors looking at opportunities in the region. The Southern Tier Startup Alliance advised on 34 startups in closing investments in 2020, where these companies raised \$43.8 Million in funding, including grants, loans and investment.

Additionally, in the 15 months since the first winners were announced in 2019, the Grow-NY Food and Agriculture Competition has made a difference on the ground in the ST, Central New York, the Finger Lakes regions of Upstate NY:

- 8 commercial leases signed
- 150+ direct jobs
- Hundreds of indirect jobs
- 100+ agreements with local producers, suppliers, and service providers

While the regional ecosystem has seen growth in access to capital, the disparity between access to capital for downstate companies and upstate companies is still large, and limits the growth of startup development in the region, and their ability to remain in the region as they grow. This challenge will need to be addressed as we continue to grow our entrepreneurial culture.

In the year ahead, the ST REDC Innovative Culture Work Group will focus on key efforts to promote the region as a well-recognized and highly desirable place to live, learn, visit and grow a business that include:

- **Tourism:** Building off of several collaboration sessions with the leadership of Tourism Promotion Agencies (TPA), the work group will strive to better align their work with both the regional development strategy and streamlining I LOVE NY efforts that are consistent with the efforts of regional stakeholders.
- **Broadband:** The work group identified an opportunity to bring 5G to the region's "last mile" broadband.
- **Inclusion:** The work group will identify additional opportunities and strategies to ensure all communities, regardless of location or size, have an opportunity to benefit from the programs being supported by the REDC.

- **Adult-use Cannabis:** The work group recognizes the plethora of new opportunities resulting from the Marijuana Regulation & Taxation Act (MRTA) and views this as an opportunity for all communities to experience entrepreneurial activity. The work group will align its efforts with the Agriculture and Advanced Manufacturing work groups to fully maximize the opportunity to establish the ST as a national leader in the research, growth and manufacture of isolates and distillates, and other high-value products related to hemp.

DEVELOP TOURISM BUSINESS IN THE SOUTHERN TIER

The Southern Tier has a wealth of natural and cultural attractions that can be leveraged into a robust and thriving tourism industry. To maximize the attractiveness of these assets, the amenities need to be enhanced by a more developed regional promotional campaign, better wayfinding signage, and a well-trained tourism and hospitality workforce that delivers an unforgettable travel experience. Some specific issues affecting the tourism industry are:

1. Workforce Development

The tourism industry has struggled to keep their doors open and their staffing at full capacity, an issue which has only become more imperative as the state lifts restrictions. The lack of workforce has greatly impacted this industry and many businesses in the ST have been unable to be open and fully operational because of struggles in attracting and retaining employees. There are myriad factors to this, such as childcare, housing, and incentives, all of which will be discussed.

Current incentives have ultimately had a negative effect on maintaining workforce. One example of this is that many employers are offering sign-on bonuses for new workers, thereby inadvertently causing workforce to move from one establishment to another in order to obtain the bonus. This recirculates workforce instead of instigating a return to employment and generates additional inefficiencies, expense, and training needs within the company. More importantly, it encourages inequalities and dissatisfaction among workers and staff members already employed prior to the incentive.

J1 workforce should be considered as an option to increase workforce during peak tourism season by better utilizing international students and employees to fill the gaps. This program could be elevated to better educate, promote, and find qualified workers and provide an alternative resource for the hospitality industry across the state.

Additionally, more robust training is needed for hospitality workforce, as is more support for diversity programs and housing options.

2. Housing

Access to available and affordable housing is a critical factor in the workforce issue, especially for seasonal housing. While there is a need for permanent housing options across the ST, many of our tourist areas rely on a seasonal workforce, and the limited number of quality temporary housing stock puts an additional strain on the ability to attract and retain employees.

Federal relief funding flowing directly to municipalities should be directed towards needed infrastructure improvements to offset the housing shortage and directly benefit the tourism industry. The ST REDC should set a goal to identify specific sites in each county to target the development of affordable and middle-income housing projects which are also desperately needed. This same strategy should be used for implementing daycare opportunities specific to the tourism industry and its unique needs, which is further outlined below. Making the connection with Rural Preservation Companies and developers can assist with these goals.

Vacant buildings situated in downtowns throughout the region should be repurposed as Hospitality Training Centers and Incubators to prepare workers for careers in the tourism sector. Education and training would be provided by area colleges and BOCES. The Kirkside Project in the Village of Roxbury, Delaware County (which has received funding from ESD and NY Main Street) is an example of one such collaboration. Furthermore, such an approach would be complimentary to efforts in the ST's four DRI communities, Elmira, Watkins Glen, Owego, and Hornell, where the interrelated initiatives of capital improvement, placemaking, and the attraction of visitors and future residents are the salient goals of the DRI program.

3. Childcare

As noted above, lack of childcare is a serious detriment to the tourism industry. There are a limited number of childcare slots available, especially for the under two population. In addition to needing more childcare centers and incentives overall, more needs to be done to encourage "non-traditional" childcare programs that would better suit those in the hospitality industry. Incentives for childcare centers and providers to offer coverage for nights, weekends, and holidays when the hospitality industry workforce needs it most should be a priority as an industry need. The ST REDC should work closely with local childcare councils on coordination and implementation efforts with state and federal programs.

4. "Stay in New York" Promotion

Enhanced effort to promote and support "Stay in NY" programs, such as the "Roam the Empire", and other marketing opportunities should be cultivated. TPAs, chambers of commerce, and economic development agencies should be leaned on to encourage New Yorker's to explore their "backyard" and visit not only their county, but also neighboring counties and regions. This will require the regions to work together and cross-promote opportunities.

An example of this type of promotion could be a "pass" or discount when visiting wineries, water trails, hiking trails, fishing, skiing, snowmobiles, parks, etc. This should be replicated throughout the state in all tourism regions.



5. Regional Wayfinding and Placemaking

The ST REDC should support existing promotions and expand regional efforts to further brand and market the ST as a connected region through additional promotion, wayfinding, and placemaking. A review of programs that connect the counties and programs to capitalize on those to attract visitors to the ST region should be prioritized. Emerging programs like the Southern Tier Water Trail could be further developed and used as a model for new concepts. This develops the goals of the statewide “Roam the Empire” campaign but highlights the local region and the assets within the ST. This should be a long-term priority for the work group to explore and adequate funding will be needed for success.

6. Education and Fellowships

Experiential learning can work to not only educate and provide “ground up” training in the hospitality industry but can also serve to assist with workforce issues through the utilization of our student demographic. Traditionally, this demographic is not encumbered with the same responsibilities and limitations of a more mature population. Community College two-year degree programs could expand to 3-year programs with fellowships required as part of the degree program. This requirement should be incorporated into the BOCES programs as well.

Practical experience in the hospitality industry can lead to career paths in hospitality, similar to the way we look at manufacturing and learning the industry from the ground up, and opportunities in Tourism, Agri-Business, and Hospitality should be viewed in the same way.

Entrepreneurship should extend beyond traditional training on how to start a business and discuss investment in succession planning for existing, successful businesses. This would provide an exit opportunity for those business owners who want to see their legacy continued while offering a less traditional start-up opportunity for entrepreneurs or current staff members. Learning the business from the perspective of current management and working towards employee ownership or succession planning would cultivate better potential for long term entrepreneurial success and business stability.

7. Broadband

Broadband issues in rural upstate New York, including connectivity, continue to be a major concern of and barrier for the tourism industry. In the current business climate, a business must have internet access, offer options for cellular service, be online friendly, and feature online purchasing options

While the work group understands that there may be an immediate draw to being “disconnected” for a short trip, there needs to always be an option to stay connected to the outside world.

We should advocate that a portion of this funding be invested into broadband to ensure seamless connectivity across the counties, regions, and state, especially in rural areas. Universal, free, public Wi-Fi access to downtowns through the region should also be considered and could be accomplished by offering boosters to local stores to create a network.

8. Use of Recovery Funds for Tourism

Federal funds will infuse millions of federal dollars into the ST through local municipalities, including cities, towns, and villages. Elected officials have stated that part of the recovery funds should be directed towards the tourism industry, yet most are not planning to utilize the funding in this way, rather choosing to address infrastructure issues, replenishing reserves, hiring safety personnel, and filling financial gaps.

The tourism industry, businesses that benefit from tourism, chambers of commerce, economic development agencies, and state agencies should advocate to ensure these funds are used in the way they were intended and hold accountable municipalities who do not allocate a portion of the funds towards this shared goal.

Infrastructure investments that benefit tourism should be prioritized; “best practices” garnered from successful programs across the state should be shared; and federal funds should be used to leverage access to additional funding to maximize the overall impact on the tourism industry and host communities.



Statewide Priorities

CHILDCARE NEEDS AND POTENTIAL SOLUTIONS

The ST REDC will address the barriers of access to quality, affordable childcare through a strategic collaboration of childcare professionals, employers, funders, parents, service providers, government officials and agencies to identify community needs. In response the ST REDC will leverage and maximize existing funding streams, support development of the childcare industry, and develop and support workforce development techniques that consider childcare as a critical facet of the workforce and economic development of the region.

With over 6,600 open positions (above pre-pandemic highs) across the ST, companies are increasingly looking for ways to hire and retain qualified employees. Consistently one of the top workforce barriers found by employers is childcare. This childcare issue affects the local businesses, families, and childcare providers.

With a decrease in supply and increase in demand, financial pressures from industry regulations, required training for staff and a competitive market for qualified staff, rising costs are passed onto families that already struggle to pay childcare expenses. This also disproportionately affects lower income populations

because childcare facilities which accept families utilizing the subsidy are at a competitive financial disadvantage that threaten the viability of childcare facilities.

Childcare tax credits that incentivize companies to provide onsite childcare is one approach to this issue but has not seen great success because many employers are simply not in the business of childcare. Several opportunities to address the barriers to quality, affordable childcare have been identified by the ST REDC Workforce Development Work Group, including:

- Proximity to care for workers;
- Options for stay-at-home parents to earn an income;
- Business incentives for employers offering or supporting care;
- Increased access to required training; and
- Stability in regulations, operational costs, funding, staffing, and compensation for childcare centers and providers.

One solution, if implemented properly and with support, is employer contributions to an employee's childcare expenses which could be partly offset by a tax credit. This will incentivize businesses to help pay for employee childcare expenses. Employees can then make up the price difference between the employer's contribution and the cost of the childcare.

Additionally, many parents feel a burden to choose between affordability and quality when selecting care for their child. Parental satisfaction is the greatest test of a quality childcare facility. Any solution should empower parents to choose the best facility to meet their particular needs. Quality childcare can be in the form of a childcare facility or in-home childcare.

To effectively address the opportunities identified in the ST, the ST REDC will support solutions that help families overcome the barriers to access to quality, affordable childcare through strategic collaboration that meaningfully:

- Increase workforce participation;
- Support cost-effective training programs to certify childcare workers;
- Decrease the needed use of a subsidy;

- Create healthier, more viable childcare facilities;
- Increase home-based care options; and
- Empower parents to make the best choices professionally and for their children.

ECONOMIC AND ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE STRATEGY

While the region has demonstrated notable improvement over the past ten years, across its economic landscape, growth has not been entirely equitable. While growth was driven in large part by gains in the educational and health-related sectors, analogous to national trends, a wide and growing gap persists between household median income in minority and white communities, high unemployment disproportionately borne by minority populations, and concentrated poverty in minority communities in urban areas.

Several opportunities to advance economic equality, environmental justice, and sustainability in the establishment of new development strategies have been identified by the Southern Tier REDC Innovative Cultures Work Group, including:

- Investment in infrastructure and downtown revitalization to build clean, energy-efficient housing and commercial space with a focus on affordable housing for vulnerable/marginalized communities; promotion of green buildings and "green" streets;
- Growth of renewable energies markets: the "green benefits" of equitable development include attracting innovation, businesses and population growth
- Focus on adaptive reuse and development in existing population centers, including those with existing contaminated properties, in order to reduce sprawl, remediate existing properties, and promote sustainable urbanization;
- Reduce exposure to facilities/industries with environmental concerns;

In 2019, the state announced Environmental Justice Community awards totaling \$1.9 Million to 21 organizations in NYS, including over \$197,000 to Southern Tier Organizations—Binghamton Regional Sustainability Coalition and Volunteers Improving Neighborhood Environments, Inc. (VINES). A new round of funding launched in 2021 demonstrates an additional opportunity to attract further state funding for environmental justice concerns.

In August 2020, the state announced 18 recipients of New York’s Environmental Justice Capacity Building Grant Program, including a \$50,000 award for VINES

SUPPORT FOR COMMUNITY INVESTMENT IN PLACEMAKING AND DOWNTOWN REVITALIZATION

The Downtown Revitalization Initiative is a comprehensive approach to boosting local economies by transforming communities into vibrant neighborhoods. After its fourth year, the program has committed \$40 Million in 4 separate downtowns in the ST (Elmira, Watkins Glen, Owego, and Hornell). According to the New York State Upstate Revitalization strategy, “placemaking is the notion that where investment occurs matters. In order to attract a talented workforce, our built environment must emphasize creating accessible job centers, sustainable infrastructure, and livable communities.”

The ST REDC acknowledges the important role of placemaking in promoting innovation and economic development, particularly in historic downtowns throughout the region. The ST REDC will focus on vibrant urban cores to improve perceptions of the region and attract private investment, new residents, innovation, and entrepreneurship. Adding to those efforts, the ST will leverage its unique and abundant natural resources, tightly knit communities that boast low costs of living, and world-renowned research universities that serve as a natural draw for a talented workforce and businesses looking for an innovative ecosystem.

The REDC will support efforts to ensure that jobs are created in places people can get to, infrastructure development is focused on places that can be maintained, and projects that increase the density of downtowns and current employment centers are supported. With support and guidance of the Innovative Cultures Work Group the REDC will support efforts that:

- Create an active, desirable downtown with a strong sense of place;
- Attract new businesses (including “Main Street” businesses), that create a robust mix of shopping, dining, entertainment and service options for residents and visitors, and that provide job opportunities for a variety of skills and salaries;
- Enhance public spaces for arts and cultural events that serve the existing members of the community but also draw in visitors from around the region;
- Attract a diverse population, with residents and workers supported by complementary diverse housing and employment opportunities;
- Grow the local property tax base; and
- Provide amenities that support and enhance downtown living and quality of life.

In addition to the strategies adopted by the Elmira, Watkins Glen, Owego, and Hornell Local Planning Committees (LPCs), the REDC will continue its efforts to identify and support downtown projects from the 2016, 2017, 2018, and 2019 DRI communities and throughout the region as described in the 2021 REDC Guidebook.

In 2021, 19 transformational projects for Hornell were announced as part of their Round 4 DRI award. The strategic investments in downtown Hornell will build upon the community’s assets, including a historic core with crucial civic and cultural uses, a strong and growing arts and business community, access to local and regional tourist attractions, and well-established and historic residential neighborhoods surrounding the downtown core. The investments are part of the Governor’s ongoing efforts to revitalize the upstate economy and create more opportunities for the ST. Specific projects funded include:

Renovate 121 Main Street as Maple City Savings Bank Offices

Renovation of building into 12 offices, a reception area, conference rooms, an IT room, two bathrooms and a small kitchen for Maple City Savings. Phase 2 includes an additional 5,000 square foot of prime office space.

Develop STEM Academy to Educate Youth in Technology Fields

Development of 2,900 SF building to house a state-of-the-art STEM education facility for area youth. Project includes building demolition, site work, building structure, HVAC work and design/ permitting code compliance.

Implement Enhancements to Pedestrian Alleyways

Enhancements to seven existing pedestrian alleyways connecting commercial corridors to public spaces and parking lots. Safety and aesthetic enhancements to be consistently applied to create a cohesive experience.

Redevelop an Underutilized Parcel to Create A Four-Season Park

Creation of a new downtown park space for flexible programming and special events, including a raised stage, walkways and pedestrian amenities.

Progress is also being made in previous DRI communities. In Owego, the Public Well Brewery project is underway. Funded with a \$439,000 DRI grant, the project looks to begin construction in the summer and fall of 2021, with an expected completion in 2022.

Additionally, in December 2020, a key project funded through the Watkins Glen DRI—the renovation of Captain Bills—was completed as part of the overall transformation of Downtown Watkins Glen. As part of the project, an outdated structure was removed to make way for a new Port of Seneca Cruise Terminal, enhancing the lakefront amenities in order to increase tourism and visually anchor downtown Watkins Glen. The project was awarded \$500,000.

Elmira, the ST's first awarded community through the Downtown Revitalization Initiative, celebrated the completion of at 100 West Water Street, a mixed-use development on a vacant lot in the center of Elmira's downtown. The project, completed in fall of 2019 and funded with a \$4,000,000 DRI grant and a \$2,300,000 Restore NY Communities Round II grant, includes a four-story building with 51 market

rate apartment units, 16,700-square-feet of retail and commercial space on the ground floor, and outdoor landscaping with amenities.

The Downtown Revitalization Initiative has led to additional development interest in awarded downtowns. Each community will continue to promote and support investment that creates a vibrant downtown and attracts new residents, visitors, businesses, and employment opportunities.

SUPPORT FOR THE WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE

Targeted job training and education is critical in addressing the ST's need for quality labor. The ST REDC will support workforce development and training programs that align worker skills with industry needs.

America's labor shortage impacts all communities, and the ST is no exception. Population projections demonstrate declining population through 2040. However, serious workforce shortages remain that threaten to slow the economy and hinder growth. Two of the largest challenges to this workforce shortage remain: 1) increasing opportunities for women with children in the workplace and 2) increasing the skills of currently unemployed or underemployed workers to match the skills needed by employers. The ST REDC will continue to prioritize and support efforts that address:

The ST reached new all-time lows in our labor market in 2020. We've rebounded some in April 2021 (compared to the COVID-19 pandemic lows in 2020) but we are still short of pre-COVID-19 pandemic levels. Specific challenges include:

- New York State's Jobs Express lists over 6,600 openings throughout the ST in a range of industries and levels of skills, with the largest number of openings in Healthcare Practitioner and Technical (943); Office, Clerical and Secretarial (648) and Sales and Related (783). Most of these positions in these fields require specific higher-level skills;
- A shortfall in affordable childcare;
- Lack of low-cost public transportation;
- Prior convictions leading to employer bias;

- Safety Net Cost/Benefit Analysis: potential financial disincentive for families and/or individuals on safety net assistance to accept lower-wage employment;
- Retention of young professionals/millennials; and
- Aligning Human Capital with Career Opportunities: effectively marketing job opportunities to the regional workforce and addressing skills gap issues.

In order to better align worker skills with industry needs and develop a pipeline of quality labor through support of targeted job training and education, the ST REDC Workforce Development Work Group will support projects that align with both the regional and statewide workforce priorities. Projects that focus on historically underserved communities or populations, workers adversely affected by the pandemic, people in recovery, and/or previously incarcerated will receive priority. The work group will also implement the following strategies that address these regional opportunities, including:

- Identify opportunities for continued support of programs and projects that align employer needs with training through regional providers and qualified educators;
- Better engage, highlight and support workforce efforts along the K-12 pipeline to help local school districts maximize impact and alignment with REDC priorities;
- Support diverse affordable childcare programs to help unlock more workforce talent;
- Encourage apprenticeship training in healthcare, childcare, manufacturing, trades, and information technology to help regional businesses hire and support more knowledgeable and productive workers;
- Support programs designed to recruit a diverse workforce and provide training for supervisors to retain these workers;
- Establish a robust social and economic equity program that creates entrepreneurship opportunities, career development, expungement of criminal records; driver's license reinstatement for fines/penalties; assistance for people to gain access to opportunities in the workforce, quality housing, etc. for members from communities disproportionately impacted by the policies of prohibition;

- Expand boot camp model for entry level work (manufacturing, healthcare, IT). This includes career pathways model. Both for high school and emerging workforce, paroles, veterans, etc. Pay people to enroll in the training (pre-hired);
- Create pathways for continuous upskilling of the workforce to meet current and future demands; (ex. robotics, virtual reality, Industry 4.0); and
- Address the need for SMART Building Techs (Association of Controls Professionals)



New Challenges

As a result of the pandemic, needs and shortfalls of the regional economy quickly became apparent, and previously known vulnerabilities were intensified. The ST REDC work groups began meeting in August 2020 to identify needs and shortfalls, as well as opportunities and recommendations, for NYS policy action. Within the six work groups, three overarching themes emerged as essential to the recovery of our regional economy:

- Expanding broadband access to underserved rural and urban areas within the region and across NYS.
- Quality, affordable, and available childcare.
- Creating a unified workforce strategy specific to the needs of ST.

Broadband, childcare, and workforce needs are inevitably linked, and only when a solution to all three is found will the ST truly be able to consider these challenges a thing of the past.


BROADBAND

Access to high-speed broadband is a challenge for most of the rural areas of the ST. Although we have made great strides through NYS's broadband program, along with both individual and coordinated efforts, many residents remain without access to high-speed internet at their homes and places of business. The impacts of this pandemic and limitations to broadband access have added urgency for school districts and

employers alike. Each ST REDC work group mentioned the need for improved broadband infrastructure. In areas that have limited or no broadband infrastructure, children cannot participate in remote learning, employees cannot work remotely, and innovation in marketing local agricultural and other products is stymied. Under these circumstances, broadband becomes a barrier to attracting tourists, and high-tech companies may not have the bandwidth to relocate to the ST. All facets of the ST economy are touched and negatively impacted by the lack of high-speed internet across the entire region. Former Congressman Brindisi, (NY-22) noted that the ST (Congressional Districts 22 and 23) hosts some of the slowest speeds in New York State.

A 2017 study by Microsoft correlates high unemployment rates with areas of low broadband access. Expansion of rural broadband will increase the quality of life and education options in the region, and it may help to lower unemployment rates by increasing the options for remote employment.

The top three barriers to full broadband deployment are:

- Affordable options. Monthly cost of wired service can be \$100 a month for basic internet services due to lack of competition in the market;
- Rural broadband buildout is seldom profitable. Companies struggle to make profit in less dense areas. Fiber buildout can cost a company anywhere between \$20,000 and \$40,000 per mile. In low density areas, it is cost prohibitive for private companies to build access; and

- Lack of competition among providers. There is little incentive for providers to offer quality service or affordable rates if there are no true competitors.

The concerns about access to, affordability of, and quality of high-speed broadband in the region are numerous. Not only does this issue highlight the digital divide, it also limits business development, entrepreneurialism, and hinders an individual's ability to work or learn from home. With many healthcare providers moving to telehealth, individuals without broadband may not be able to access new innovations in healthcare.

The ST is not unique with the rural broad-band issues, but the true long-term solutions will require legislative and financial commitments from counties and municipalities. Efforts must include modified policies at the State and Federal levels as well as highly driven groups of individuals who must continually work with providers, non-profits, and governments to expand services until all households and businesses are served. Rural broadband (like rural electrification and rural telephonization) is a necessity and should be strategically implemented like a utility.

CHILDCARE

ST REDC work groups also focused on the impacts of childcare on the economy. Spaces for children in registered childcare centers were scarce across the ST region prior to the COVID-19 pandemic. A recent survey of childcare centers in the region found that 36% of programs closed at the start of the pandemic. As childcare centers began to re-open, they found that enrollment had severely decreased due to families impacted by job loss and remote work, which resulted in a reduced need for services.

In addition to childcare centers dealing with a loss of income, they have increased costs due to the necessary safety measures related to the COVID-19 pandemic. The first round of CARES Act funding and other federal assistance programs such as Payroll Protection Program were helpful to some childcare programs, but they did not address the long-term impacts of low enrollment and increased costs, creating another barrier for low wage workers to enter the workforce, further complicating the childcare landscape.

The childcare system serves many fundamental purposes: care for children of working parents, socialization, preschool acclimation and targeted intervention for high-needs children, among others. Due to the change in the “normal” working environment and the challenges of reopening childcare facilities, childcare costs have increased, the availability of subsidized services are uncertain and the number of children with risk factors, such as poverty, have grown. In addition, the hybrid school environment has added to the complexity and need for childcare, as some parents may now only need care on days their children are learning remotely, which adds a complication to the “seats” available with the daycare providers.

These new challenges to operating childcare programs from infant to school-aged require creative policy changes and programs that will support a childcare landscape better suited for addressing the existing and emerging needs of the region.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Multiple work groups stressed the mismatch between identified skills gaps and the programs offered for skills training. For companies that identified skill gaps in their employees, most indicated they would prefer to provide that training in house. To address these concerns, it is necessary to catalog existing needs, forecast future needs, and create a flexible program to fund creative solutions to our region's identified concerns.

Talent attraction opportunities were mentioned by all work groups, with a focus on how to attract qualified workers to the region by using the low infection rate in the ST along with the high quality of life and standard of living as a draw. The ST's historically low wages work against the goal of talent attraction, and we know that the rising NYS minimum wage is also a concern for the region's small businesses. Working with leading industry professionals, the region must find a path forward to increase wages to better sell the region to incoming professionals while ensuring that businesses remain solvent.

Previously Funded CFA Projects

Introduction

CFA PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

One highlight of the Round 9 CFA awards is a \$2.28 million grant for Upstate Farms Cheese, LLC, a subsidiary of farmer-owned Upstate Niagara Cooperative, Inc. The project will include the modernization of the facility in the Town of Campbell in Steuben County. The company plans to increase production through investment in plant modernization and equipment upgrades. The project will create additional production jobs and create additional demand for milk, an important sector for the ST's agriculture industry. Project completion is slated for the fall of 2023.

2020 saw the completion of the Lupo's Meat Processing Plant Capital project. The project was funded with \$250,000 in grant dollars awarded in Round 9 of the CFA and included the construction of a United States Department of Agriculture ("USDA") compliant meat processing plant in the Village of Endicott in Broome County, including a new freezer, two coolers, a large production room, a sausage room and a large packaging room. The project creates jobs and supports a long-standing business's growth in their home community.

Besides successful projects from Round 9, this past year also saw the completion of many projects from previous rounds. Glamping at Watkins Glen MNY Capital, in Schuyler County, funded with \$385,189 in Round 8 through Market New York, opened for visitors in summer 2021. Operating as Naturluxe & Stars, the project will tap into a growing niche, offering comfort, convenience, and high-end amenities that make it easy and enjoyable for tourists to enjoy nature and the adjacent Watkins Glen International raceway. Ultimately, the project will increase tourism in and around Watkins Glen, leveraging the region's existing tourism assets and adding a new experience for visitors.

Another Round 8 CFA project, LECOM Capital finished construction in March 2020 and welcomed their first class in the summer of 2020. LECOM, or the Lake Erie College of Osteopathic Medicine, constructed a four-year medical training facility in the City of Elmira, Chemung County. The school will educate 120 students in each cohort and train physicians for in-demand careers in the Southern Tier. LECOM received a \$3,000,000 grant to complete the project.

Overview of Previously Funded Priority Projects

Over the past nine rounds, **188 Priority Projects** have been awarded funding from Empire State Development Grant Funds through the Southern Tier Regional Economic Development Council process. These strategic investments have leveraged more than **\$885 million** through **\$132 million** in public support, representing a total strategic investment in the region of nearly **\$1.02 billion**. In CFA Round 9 alone, priority projects leveraged more than **\$70 million** through a public investment of **\$13 million**.
